AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MCKINNEY, TEXAS, REAFFIRMING THE CITY OF MCKINNEY'S CONTINUED PARTICIPATION IN THE TEXAS ENTERPRISE ZONE PROGRAM PURSUANT TO THE TEXAS ENTERPRISE ZONE ACT, CHAPTER 2303, TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE; IDENTIFYING AND SUMMARIZING POTENTIAL BUSINESS AND TAX INCENTIVES THAT MAY BE MADE AVAILABLE TO PARTICIPANTS IN SUCH PROGRAM; DESIGNATING A LIAISON TO COMMUNICATE WITH INTERESTED PARTIES AND NOMINATING GLOBE LIFE AND ACCIDENT INSURANCE COMPANY TO THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND TOURISM THROUGH THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT BANK AS AN ENTERPRISE PROJECT; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

- **WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of McKinney, Texas (the "City") desires to create the proper economic and social environment to induce the investment of private resources in productive business enterprises located in distressed areas of the City and to provide employment to residents of such areas; and
- **WHEREAS,** the City Council on May 18, 2010, passed Ordinance No. 2010-05-014 electing to participate in the Texas Enterprise Zone Program as authorized by the Texas Enterprise Zone Act; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City Council subsequently passed Ordinance No. 2016-01-006 amending the business and tax incentives that may be available to participants through the Texas Enterprise Zone Program on January 19, 2016; and
- WHEREAS, the City Council subsequently passed Ordinance No. 2017-11-101 amending the business and tax incentives that may be available to participants through the Texas Enterprise Zone Program on November 29, 2017; and
- WHEREAS, the City Council hereby reaffirms its continued participation in the Texas Enterprise Zone Program ("Program") pursuant to the Texas Enterprise Zone Act, Chapter 2303, Texas Government Code, ("Act"); and
- WHEREAS, the City provided written notice of a public hearing regarding the enterprise zone and the City's continued participation in the Program as authorized by the Act, which public hearing to consider this ordinance was held by the City Council on August 20, 2024; and
- WHEREAS, the Texas Administrative Code §176.2(2)(A) requires the City to state via ordinance that the governing body is in full compliance with Chapter 2303, of the Texas Government Code prior to the nomination of an eligible business; and
- **WHEREAS,** pursuant to Chapter 2303, Subchapter F of the Act, Globe Life and Accident Insurance Company has applied to the City for designation as an enterprise project; and
- WHEREAS, the City Council finds that Globe Life and Accident Insurance Company (the "Enterprise Project") meets the criteria for tax relief and other incentives adopted by the City on the grounds that it will be located at the qualified business site, will create a higher level of employment, economic activity and stability; and
- WHEREAS, the Project is not located in an area designated as an enterprise zone.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MCKINNEY, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1. FINDINGS

The findings set forth above are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated into the body of this Ordinance for all purposes as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. **INCENTIVES AVAILABLE**

The local business and tax incentives identified and summarized in the attached Exhibit A, at the election of the governing body, are or will be made available to any nominated "Project" or "Activity," as those terms are defined by the Act, of a qualified business site.

Section 3. ENTERPRISE ZONE AREAS CONSIST OF REINVESTMENT ZONES

The enterprise zone areas within the City are reinvestment zones in accordance with Chapter 312 of the Texas Tax Code.

Section 4. CITY MANAGER OR HIS DESIGNEE TO ACT AS LIAISON

The McKinney City Council directs and designates the City Manager, or his designee, to serve as the City's liaison to communicate and negotiate with the Office of the Governor, Economic Development and Tourism, enterprise project(s) and other entities affected by the enterprise zone program; and, to otherwise oversee enterprise zone activities and communicate with qualified businesses and other entities situated within and about an enterprise zone.

Section 5. **CITY CONFIRMATION**

The City confirms via this Ordinance that it is in full compliance with Chapter 2303 of the Texas Government Code prior to the nomination of the eligible business. Further, the City is in full compliance with participation Rule §176.2 of the Texas Administrative Code through this Ordinance and all required submissions to the Bank under Rule §176.2.

Section 6. **CITY NOMINATION**

The City herby nominates Globe Life and Accident Insurance Company for enterprise project status.

Section 7. NOMINATED ENTERPRISE PROJECT

The City finds that Globe Life and Accident Insurance Company meets the criteria for designation as an enterprise project under Chapter 2303, Subchapter F of the Act on the following grounds:

- A. Globe Life and Accident Insurance Company is a "qualified business" under Section 2303.402 of the Act since it will be engaged in the active conduct of a trade or business at a qualified business site within the governing body's jurisdiction, located outside of an enterprise zone and at least thirty-five percent (35%) of the business' new employees will be residents of an enterprise zone, economically disadvantaged individuals, or veterans; and
- B. There has been and will continue to be a high level of cooperation between public, private, and neighborhood entities in the area; and
- C. The designation of Globe Life and Accident Insurance Company as an enterprise project will contribute significantly to the achievement of the plans of the City for development and revitalization of the area.

Section 8. **DESIGNATION PERIOD**

The Enterprise Project shall take effect on the date of designation of the enterprise project by the Office of the Governor Economic Development and Tourism and terminate five (5) years after the date of designation.

Section 9. **EFFECTIVE DATE**
