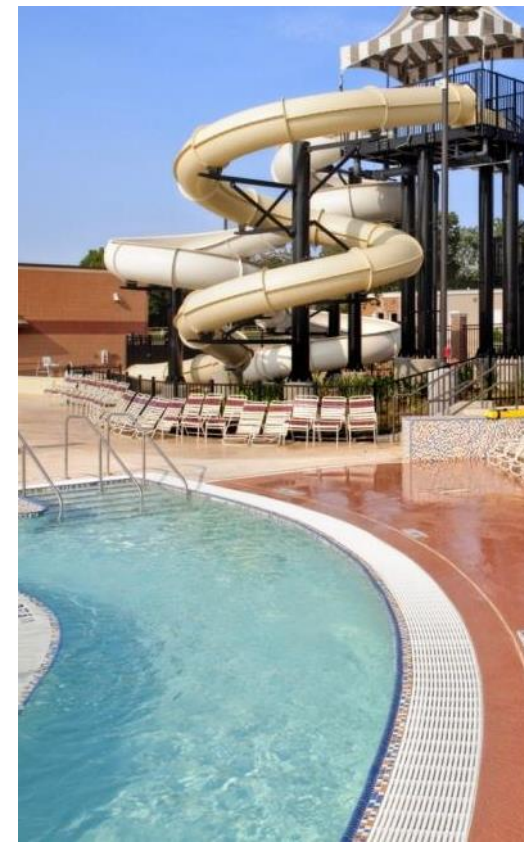

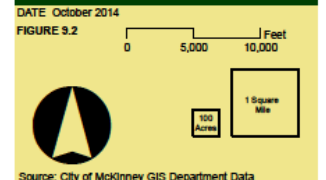

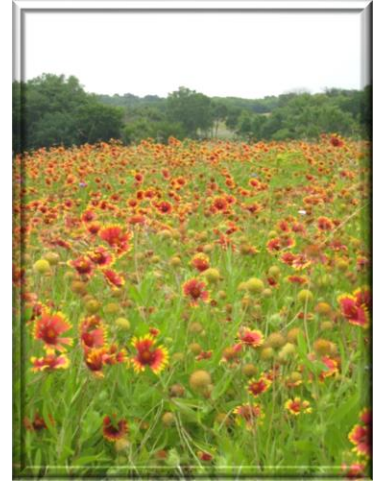
PROCESS

- Start Work
- \$250,000 Project Funding MCDC
- Contract w/ Halff Associates Approved by City Council
- **Committee Consideration (3 City Council + 3 MCDC + 3 PROS Board)**
- Kickoff Project & Complete w/ in 12-16 Months

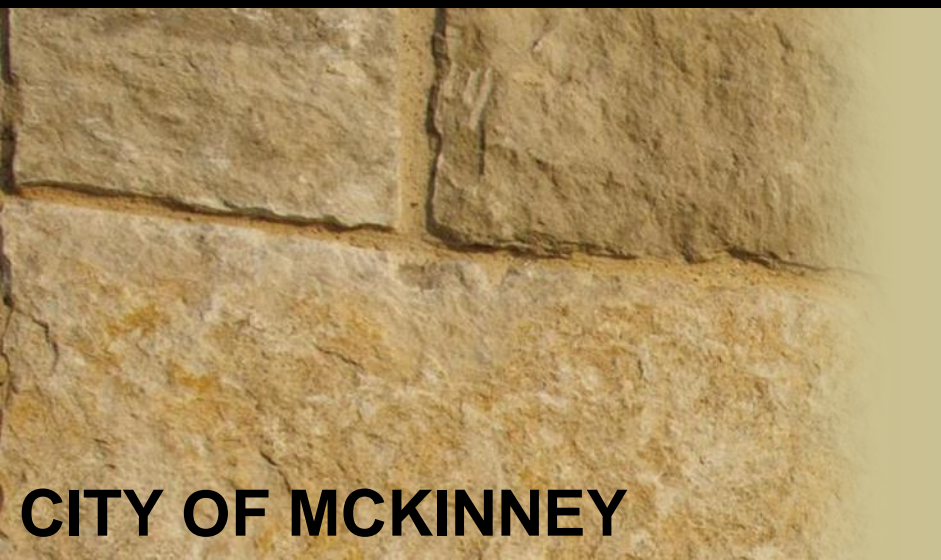

TIMELINE

TIMELINE

- Community Development Corporation
 - August 27th - Request for two Board members-appointed three
- Parks and Recreation Advisory Board
 - September 10th - Request for three Board members
- City Council
 - August 31st – Discuss the creation of a Visioning Committee-appointed three
 - September 15th - Request for appointments of three Council members, three Park Board members and three MCDC members
- Visioning Advisory Committee
 - Staff anticipates that the first Advisory Committee meeting will be held in late September or October
