The Gift of Zyng

The Gift of Zyng: Ex-Zynga employees form startups

When San Francisco-based gaming giant Zynga closed its remaining Dallas office, it sparked a wave of innovative

startups, bolstering, rather than dragging down, North Texas' growing mobile gaming industry.

They've left the FarmVille, ended their Words With Friends and decided to Draw Something new. Former employees of Zynga Dallas are taking the skills they bolstered at the San Francisco-based mobile and Internet gaming company and using them to build a new castle, all their own.

When Zynga closed its Dallas location the first week of June, about 50 employees were left asking: Where do we go now?

Luckily for many of them, the answer was not far. Interviews with former employees reveal at least five new mobile gaming companies that have sprouted from Zynga's once-hefty Dallas-area operations. Many are in the very early startup stages, but all have high hopes for future success.

"People who are former Zynga employees now are viewing this as an opportunity to do some of the things they would not have been able to do before," said Eric Shen, former director of operations for Zynga Dallas. Shen joined another former Zynga manager, Grant Yang, and his brother, Jason Yang, as vice president of development at Kumakore LLC, which runs back-end operations for gaming companies. "We're definitely leveraging the experience we got."

This wave of entrepreneurship is certainly good news for those who were looking for work, but it also has broader implications.

In 2008, Gov. Rick Perry began a campaign to attract video gaming development companies to the state, with the intent of Texas becoming the national leader in video gaming jobs and production. "I congratulate this growing industry on its success," he said at the E3 Media and Business summit where he launched the campaign, "and invite further expansion in Texas where the barbecue is hot and the video gaming is even hotter."

Today, Dallas ranks second in the state in terms of total video game companies, with approximately 50, behind Austin, which has more than 100.

The spark

Zynga's decision to lay off 18 percent of its workforce, closing its Dallas, New York and Los Angeles offices, was an effort to offset its dwindling revenue and users. The

company struggled through 2012, reporting quarterly losses during every earnings period. By the end of the year, the company posted a total loss of \$209 million. (Excluding a number of special charges, its non-GAAP net income was \$58.2 million.) In the second quarter of this year, it lost \$16 million on sales of \$231 million. It also lost 33 million daily active users.

"I want to thank every one of you for the spirit, creativity and energy that you've invested in Zynga," then-CEO Mark Pincus wrote in a letter to employees when the three offices shut down. "You've reintroduced a generation of people to gaming and through these games offered them new ways to connect with their families, make new friends and even sometimes find love."

Some employees said they saw the "writing on the wall" and began pursing new ventures before the closure. Others stuck with the company and are just now finding a fix for antsy fingers.

But for many employees, the end of their career at Zynga delivered an unexpected power-up.

It's a cycle common to the gaming industry, according to <u>Terry Clower</u>, director of the Center of Economic Development and Research at the <u>University of North Texas</u>.

"What you can get is a dynamic system where you have birth, death and rebirth," Clower said. "And that rebirth can have many instances, but for all that to happen you have to have a policy environment and economic development environment that encourages it."

Texas has been working to foster just such an environment. Video gaming companies in the state are allowed to participate in the Texas Moving Image Industry Incentive Program. They have the opportunity to receive a payment of a percentage of eligible Texas spending or eligible wages paid to Texas residents, which is equal to grants and financial incentives applied to the film and television industry. In June 2013, the Texas legislature tripled the program's funding to a total of \$95 million.

In development

Kumakore is just one of a handful of ventures by former Zynga employees.

<u>Dave Pottinger</u>, former lead designer for Zynga's CastleVille, joined two former coworkers from Microsoft's Ensemble Studios Inc., which closed in 2009, to found BonusXP Inc. last year. Nine of Bonus XP's 14 employees formerly worked for Zynga.

"It's a testament to how many good people were there," Pottinger said, adding that having former colleagues as BonusXP candidates has helped expedite finding the right talent for the team. "We actually don't have anybody who hasn't worked with at least half the studio."

Former Zynga Dallas general manager <u>David Rippy</u> has joined <u>Scott Winsett</u>, Zynga Dallas senior art director, and <u>Bill Jackson</u>, Zynga Dallas creative director, along with about 17 other former Zynga employees to create new mobile gaming company,

reportedly called Boss Fight Entertainment, which will launch later this month.

<u>Andy Gotcher</u>, former Zynga Dallas art director, joined <u>Dave Calla</u>, former Zynga Dallas developer, to found Oh So Shiny LLC, a mobile app and gaming company that was incorporated in mid-July.

"He (Andy) and I have been thinking about it forever," said Calla, who left about two months before Zynga's closure. "We always sort of kicked it around. Finally, it became time."

Mike McGary reunited with former business partner Guy Saenger to breathe life back into Avacata Inc., the application development company Saenger started in 1997. Paul Bettner and David Bettner, creators of Words with Friends and owners of Newtoy Inc., have also reportedly acquired a couple former Zynga employees. Paul Bettner is now running Verse Inc., a McKinney-based gaming company that will soon be renamed Playful Corp. David Bettner is reportedly also working on a new venture but has not released any details.

For many of these former employees, the chance to start over gave them the opportunity to pursue what initially led them to the companies that would eventually become Zynga: work with a small team, focused on pushing out one quality game at a time.

"We've worked on games that were big and successful, but it works better when there are just a few people," said Gotcher, who created Xbox games at Ensemble before working at Newtoy, which Zynga later acquired. "Something special happens when you're doing it for fun: It doesn't seem like a job anymore."



Last week McKinney National Airport's "The Time is Wright" billboard was perched along the Dallas North Tollway close to downtown, next to Crow Holdings HQ; today it's close to the Forest Lane exit. The airport hopes Dallas' traffic, at least some of its air traffic, follows along as it keeps moving north: McKinney officials are using it as bait to lure business from Dallas Love Field to McKinney National once the Wright Amendment finally dies its slow death come October.

"We're not trying to poach," says the airport's executive director Ken Wiegand. "But the Wright Amendment repeal is coming, and we're thinking that more commercial traffic in Dallas will have an effect on business aviation traffic, which is our business. And if you need to make a choice, choose us. That's all we're saying."

The timing for the push is certainly right: On Monday the city of Dallas finally OK'd turning over two gates to Virgin America, which will fly from Dallas to five big-city destinations including New York and Los Angeles, and just today Southwest CEO Gary Kelly spoke of adding 50 destinations as flight restrictions are removed from Love, including "plenty of international destinations."
