PROJECT DELIVERY SYSTEM

A/E's services, compensation and time schedule for performance of services are based on the use of the Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) with one prime construction contract project delivery system and are subject to adjustment if another delivery system is utilized.

Based on feedback gathered from our showroom tours, A/E will develop a furniture presentation to review furniture for each room/type of space. This review will include 2-3 options per furniture piece for review/selection by Owner. This meeting will also include an initial furniture finish palette for review/discussion. As we review the furniture type, we will want to confirm we have clarification on finish requirements or preferred finishes. Information gathered here will help tailor the selections for the Finish Selection meeting.

- FF&E Finish Selections Review

Following furniture selections and review of finish requirements and preferences identified through previous meetings, the A/E will develop a furniture finish presentation. This portion will provide physical samples of proposed finishes for each furniture piece that aligns with the budget, requirements and preferences identified by Owner.

Furniture Binder/Bidding

A/E will compile all information approved by Owner and produce a furniture binder which will include specification sheets for each piece of furniture along with furniture floor plans. This information will be shared with the furniture dealers along with bidding instruction and forms.

Procurement

A/E will request, review and approve quotes provided by furniture dealers. Once evaluated, we will provide the prepared quote to Owner and their purchasing department.

Installation Oversight/Punch Walk

A/E will coordinate with the installation of furniture to ensure pieces are delivered and installed damage free. If any issues are identified, the A/E will follow up with dealer to remedy the solution.

12. STRUCTURAL PEER REVIEW

Services: Review to determine if the provided structural drawings and specifications for the project are in general compliance with the structural requirements of the applicable building code and any other special requirements agreed to as part of the design.

- Two peer reviews will be conducted. The first will be at the completion of Design Development and the second will be conducted at approximately 75% completion of Construction Documents.

The A/E will assist the Client and the CMAR in the preparation of necessary bidding information, bidding forms, the Conditions of the Contract, and the form of Agreement between the Client and the CMAR. The A/E will inform the Client, to the best of their knowledge, and will assist the Client in connection with the Client's responsibility for filing documents required for approval of governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the Project.

TASK B: CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION SERVICES

The A/E shall not supervise, direct or have control over the CMAR's work nor have any responsibility for the construction means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures selected by the CMAR nor for the CMAR's safety precautions or programs in connection with the Work. These rights and responsibilities are solely those of the CMAR. The Client agrees that the CMAR shall be solely responsible for jobsite and worker safety and warrants that this intent shall be carried out in the Client's contract with the CMAR.

QUALIFICATIONS

The Client shall designate a representative authorized to act in the Client's behalf who shall make decisions with respect to the Project. The Client, or such authorized representative, shall examine the design documents submitted by A/E and shall render decisions pertaining thereto promptly, to avoid unreasonable delay in the process of A/E's design services.

Client warrants that in transmitting existing documents prepared by other designers or design professionals, or any other information, Client is the copyright Client of such information or has permission from the copyright Client to transmit such information for its use on the Project.

OPINIONS OF PROBABLE CONSTRUCTION COST

In providing estimates or opinions of probable construction cost, the Client understands that the A/E has no control over the cost or availability of labor, equipment or materials, or over market conditions or the CMAR's method of pricing, and that the A/E's estimates or opinions of probable construction costs are made on the basis of the A/E's professional judgment and experience. The A/E makes no warranty, express or implied, that the bids or the negotiated construction cost will not vary from the A/E's estimates or opinions of probable construction cost.

The A/E will engage a Cost Estimating Consultant to provide additional expertise in cost estimating which has a historical accuracy over the last four years of approximately ±1%.

ACCESSIBILITY

The Client acknowledges that the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), Texas Accessibility Standards (TAS) for projects in the State of Texas, and other federal, state and local accessibility laws, rules, codes, ordinances, and regulations will be subject to various and possibly contradictory interpretations. The Client further acknowledges that the ADA is a Civil Rights law and not a building code and does not have prescriptive language. A/E, therefore, will use its reasonable professional efforts and judgements, in working alongside the Accessibility Consultant's direction & recommendations, to interpret applicable accessibility requirements in effect as of the date of the execution of this Agreement, and as they apply to the Project. A/E, however, cannot and does not warrant or guarantee that the Client's Project will comply with all interpretations of the accessibility

requirements and/or the requirements of other federal, state and local laws, rules, codes, ordinances and regulations as they apply to the Project.

All projects in the State of Texas must be submitted to the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulations (TDLR) – Elimination of Architectural Barriers (EAB) Division for plan review for compliance with TAS requirements. A/E will include in the design of the Project all changes that are the result of the TDLR plan review. After construction of the project TDLR requires an inspection of the project for compliance confirmation. However, A/E cannot and does not warrant or guarantee that different rules and or interpretation may be applied to the Client's Project at the time of the final TDLR inspection. Compliance with changes required by the TDLR final inspection that were not mentioned in the TDLR plan may be required.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

As used in this Proposal, the term hazardous materials shall mean any substances, including without limitation asbestos, toxic or hazardous waste, PCBs, combustible gases and materials, petroleum or radioactive materials (as each of these is defined in applicable federal statutes) or any other substances under any conditions and in such quantities as would pose a substantial danger to persons or property exposed to such substances at or near the project site.

All parties acknowledge that the A/E's scope of services does not include any services related to the presence of any hazardous or toxic materials. In the event A/E or any other person or entity involved in the project encounters any hazardous or toxic materials, or should it become known to A/E that such materials may be present on or about the jobsite or any adjacent areas that may affect the performance of A/E's services, A/E may, at its sole option and without liability for consequential or any other damages, suspend performance of its services under this Agreement until the Client retains appropriate qualified consultants and/or CMARs to identify and abate or remove the hazardous or toxic materials and warrants that the jobsite is in full compliance with all applicable laws and regulations.

SERVICES BY CLIENT

Client will provide access to work site, obtain applicable permits, provide appropriate legal services in connection with the project, and provide environmental impact reports and energy assessments unless specifically included in the Scope of Work. Client shall pay the costs of checking and inspection fees, zoning application fees, soils engineering fees, testing fees, surveying fees, and all other fees, permits, bond premiums, and all other charges not specifically covered by the terms of this Agreement.
