Music in Motion: An Artful Journey of Sight and Sound (October 8, 2016)

Music in Motion 2016 was held all day at the McKinney Performing Arts Center, utilizing 3 rooms on the main floor for both art and music performances. In the lower floor Art Gallery, there was an exhibit of art responding to poetry, and after the poetry readings there was a reception in the Gallery as well.

The cost was FREE to the public, and advertising included online calendars, social media postings, a dedicated webpage/URL, ads in the Stonebridge HOA and Craig Ranch HOA magazines, and an article in Allen Image. Guests were greeted and counted at all doors. First time visitors were given a brief orientation. Several guests were attracted by the potter and painter demonstrating on the MPAC lawn. Artists and musicians come from all over the DFW area, including Fort Worth, Arlington, Denton, Allen, Frisco, and Plano. The event was free to the artists exhibiting, and several artists sold works of art.

The artists and musicians truly enjoy Music in Motion. They exhibit and demonstrate, working to the great music. In total, 48 creatives (performers, poets and artists) engaged approximately 420 guests throughout the day.



The variety of music offered was truly impressive, from Classical Chamber Music to Bluegrass, with musicians from McKinney as well as the greater DFW area. Music in Motion is a great opportunity for local musicians to network with professionals from the greater region, often resulting in further collaborations in the future. Guests made their way through the different rooms, some leaving for lunch on the Square and returning for more music. The collaboration with the Mockingbird Poetry Society was particularly successful – poets loved reading their poems next to artwork done in response to the poems. Guests and participants loved the event!



Summer Music Intensives (July 24-30, 2017, M-F 9am-4pm in the Education Building (HUB) of the First United Methodist Church, with afternoon concerts Friday (HUB), Saturday (HUB) and Sunday (Church Street Auditorium)

This year the camp drew 80 middle school and high school students from McKinney, Plano, Prosper, Denton, Allen, Lovejoy and Frisco. Jason Lim, director of the Odysseus Chamber Orchestra, continued in the role as Artistic Director. His professionalism and vision was appreciated by students, parents and faculty. There was a wonderful atmosphere of excellence and joy at the camp. Students chose from classical orchestra and ensemble experiences, improvisation, conducting, music theory, Celtic music, and a Blend of pop/jazz/folk music. Intermediate and advanced students studied privately with string faculty. The culminating performances were marketed through City and arts online calendars and attended by audiences of over 425 people.

Our marketing through teachers, through the master classes (which were performed for approximately 450 students) at area middle and high schools, and postings on area ISD websites was successful. Several students and parents considered low tuition and local proximity in choosing the camp. Tuition was \$165., and students were provided additional financial assistance as needed. No students were turned away, and one student received a full scholarship donated by the Luthier Shop of Denton, a strong supporter of Jason Lim and the Odysseus Orchestra.
