What is the purpose of Legacy Keepers?

•We will use the strength of our unique identities in a collective framework to document, honor and promote the historic legacies of McKinney's Black and Mexican communities, ensuring that all cultures are natural parts of the community's experiences.

Strategic Goals and Objectives:

- We will identify **CURRENT RESOURCES** that are available. (e.g., People, Ross Cemetery, Mexican Cemetery, Holy Family School/ES Doty site, Churches, Story Maps, MPAC, Collin County History Museum, Texas Historic Commission, photographs, film, artifacts, financial grants, business ideas, etc.)
- We will identify **CURRENT OPPORTUNITIES** (up to 6 months). (formalize committee, walking/trolley/online/food tours, document the process via press, product development, product showcase, etc.)
- We will identify **GAPS OF DISCOVERY**. (capturing film/oral stories/documented history, addressing development opportunities/challenges as the Black and Brown communities are redeveloped, field trips, social media presence, art, cultural/museum site, etc.)
- We will set ongoing and **LONG-TERM GOALS**. (research, historic sites/landmarks, cemeteries, etc.)
- We will **WORK WITH THE COMMUNITY** to identify ultimate goals. (free standing sites; artifacts within City Hall; events across the community, etc.)
