The McKinney City Council has approved changing the name of Collin County Regional Airport to McKinney National Airport.

The decision comes after the city bought the airport assets.

It began as McKinney Municipal Airport 34 years ago. Since then, it has added a 7,000 foot commercial-grade runway, an air traffic control tower and U.S. Customs services for international flights.

At least 200 aircraft, including 30 jets, must use an airport to receive “national” designation from the Federal Aviation Administration.

Jim Wehmeier, president of the McKinney Economic Development Corp., said the airport is a “major attraction” in recruiting companies to the city. The airport can provide corporate hangars and landing pads, he said.

Ken Wiegand, director of the McKinney National Airport, said the sale of fuel and other services will generate revenue to fund improvements to the airport to lure more corporate aircraft and business to the city. McKinney, with more than 142,000 people, has been one of the nation’s fastest-growing cities.

'McKinney National Airport' Name Change Official as City Takes Over Operations



The City of McKinney's takeover of Collin County Regional Airport is complete. On Nov. 1, the city took full control of the airport's operation and began full management of the airport.

On Tuesday night, the McKinney City Council voted to rename the airport to reflect the city's ownership, both literal and figurative, of the airport.

Collin County Regional Airport is no more.

Meet McKinney National Airport.

The new name of McKinney's airport was initially revealed as the choice of city staff in September, but the name change was made official by a unanimous vote of the council during Tuesday's meeting.

The council also approved the renaming of the FBO (fixed base operation) at the airport, previously run by Cutter Aviation. McKinney Air Center will now serve as the city-controlled FBO at McKinney National Airport and will provide fueling and ground services at the airport.

According to a release from the city announcing the launch of the city-controlled airport, "McKinney Air Center will offer a wide variety of services, including 24-hour fuel and ramp services, catering, courtesy crew cars, flight planning and weather facilities, on-site auto rental, private crew lounge, sleep room and showers, and U.S. Customs on-site." McKinney Air Center

The changing of the names completes the city's takeover of the airport from Schuler Development. The city purchased assets at the airport from Schuler for \$25 million.

Mayor Brian Loughmiller said that the city needs to take advantage of the "national" designation bestowed upon the airport by the FAA and fully supports the new name. "If we're going to invest the money, then we need to take ownership of it," Loughmiller told his fellow council members during the discussion prior to the vote on the airport's new name.

Councilman Ray Ricchi questioned the process of selecting the name McKinney National Airport, asking Loughmiller if the city held any focus groups to discuss the airport's new name. Loughmiller told Ricchi that the council members and city staff selected the name.

"We need to recognize the commitment of the city and its people," City Manager Jason Gray said. Loughmiller added that having McKinney as part of the name of the airport and the FBO will help clarify the airport's location and help to enhance the image of the city.

"Other cities, like Frisco, tie their names to the projects they fund," Loughmiller said. "We need to do the same thing."

COLLIN COLLEGE PROFESSOR NAMED 2013 TEXAS PROFESSOR OF THE YEAR

The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching and the Council for Advancement and Support of Education on Thursday named Collin College communication studies professor Ceilidh Charleson-Jennings the 2013 Texas Professor of the Year. This achievement marks the sixth Carnegie Professor of the Year for Collin College, a feat unmatched by any college or university in the state of Texas.

“We are so proud of Professor Charleson-Jennings for receiving the pinnacle award in teaching,” said Mac Hendricks, chair of the college’s Board of Trustees. “This outstanding professor exemplifies the college’s core values inside and outside of the classroom.”

The Professor of the Year program, now in its 33rd year, is the only national initiative that focuses solely on excellent undergraduate teaching and mentoring. Professor Charleson-Jennings accepted the award at a Washington D.C. ceremony in the Ronald Reagan Building and International Trade Center. CASE and Carnegie also honored Professor Charleson-Jennings at a Congressional reception at the Folger Shakespeare Library on Capitol Hill.

According to Collin College district president Cary A. Israel, "Professor Charleson-Jennings is an extraordinary professor as well as a *New York Times* best-selling author, flight instructor and search and rescue expert. For more than 20 years, she has propelled Collin College students toward their dreams. She also forged close-working relationships with industry professionals and provided our students the unique experience of working with nationally renowned producers and editors," Israel said.



Israel added, "This award marks back-to-back Texas Professors of the Year for the college, so the college is now home to *three* Texas and *three* U.S. Professors of the Year." Israel stated that Professor Charleson-Jennings and her Collin College colleagues have won more Carnegie Professor of the Year accolades than Cornell, Northwestern, Vanderbilt, Johns Hopkins, Georgetown, Rice, Texas Christian University and the University of Texas at Austin.
