



GENERAL LANDSCAPE NOTES:

- I. All proposed landscaping is to be installed as per local city ordinances and
- 2. Existing trees to be saved shall be protected by tree protective fencing before construction begins. (REFER TO CIVIL PLANS FOR DETAILS). No equipment or materials shall be stored, operated or maintained within the fenced area. Fences shall be at the dripline and completely surround the tree or clusters of trees. No fires or cleaning of equipment trucks will be allowed in
- 3. Irrigation shall be by automated underground system to be installed prior to planting. Large open spaces will have spray or rotary nozzles. Piping that extends into the critical root zone of existing trees shall be hand dug.
- 4. All landscaping, replacement, screening, buffering, street yard, and all other revegetated areas shall have adequate irrigation provided to sustain growth.
- Landscaping to be maintained and replaced as required to meet ordinance requirements.
- 6. Owner may make reasonable substitutions of equivalent trees for those species shown on the landscape plan tree legend. Additionally, the owner may elect to provide plant material above and beyond the materials shown on this plan.
- 7. All areas of native vegetation beyond the limits of construction shall be left undisturbed.
- 8. All proposed trees shown on this plan are for landscape requirements and replacement trees. Replacement trees shall be designated on plan by an (R) placed next to the trunk, canopy, or plant label. All replacement trees shall be irrigated by an automated underground system to be installed prior to planting.
- 9. Landscaping shall be protected by concrete curbing, curb stops or equivalent barriers in vehicular use areas.
- 10. All required landscape planting areas shall be a minimum of 8 feet in width (soil area). Large parking lots shall have medians with a 10 foot minimum (soil area).
- 11. All plant materials and irrigation shall be in place and operational at the time of landscape inspection for Certificate of Occupancy. Fiscal posting shall be made in lieu of a completed landscape installation.
- 12. No more than 50% of the proposed plant material shall be from the same genus or species.
- 13. The OWNER will continuously maintain the required landscaping in accordance with the Land Development Code Section 25-8 in effect at the time of this plan approval.
- 14. If establishing vegetation during any stage of a drought, Section 6-4-30 may require a variance. Contact Austin Water Conservation staff at waterusecompvar@austintexas.gov or call (512) 974-2199.

CITY OF MCKINNEY NOTES:

The contractor shall verify water restrictions within the City of McKinney at time of planting. Should water restrictions not allow hydro-mulch, hydro seeding, or sprigging (stage 3 and Stage 4 water restrictions), an approved alternative for grassing shall be installed.


