Business Retention & Expansion Program

On the retention side, all is good and we haven't heard of anyone leaving. So that is good!

We are now fully engaged in the StatLab expansion and even though early in the process, lots going on.

On Emerson - They're moving in! On Monday, September 9th, employee move in started. They received their Temporary CO the day before and so the move began. In speaking with Ira Dalhman, VP Human Resources, all was proceeding pretty well and all are very excited. Now they just have to get organized, back to work and prepare for the November 8th community open house!

Major Employer Surveys

One of the key elements of the BRE Program is Major Employer Surveys. To date, I am actively working thirteen companies to which I have eight completed. This effort continues and ongoing.

Emerging Technology

Emerging Technology Program updates: At this time I am having discussions with three different companies. The three companies do not meet The Collide Center criteria based on their size, and so will be evaluated as BREP & ET program candidates. One of the companies will be presenting today. Activity has certainly picked up since The Center has opened.

Today marks the three month anniversary of the opening of The Collide Center. At this time we have 18 resident companies, one anchor tenant (Curious Complex) and the Boss Fight Entertainment group upstairs. All toll, we have 60 people in and out since we opened with more applications on deck and a few more waiting in the wings. The Collide Corridor is functioning as our "break room" and "extra space" at the moment, as not all of the furniture is in yet. The Cotton Mill is also in the process of refinishing the floor so, until we have it all put together, we are not "formally" announcing the public opening, but hope to do so in the next week or so. In any event, we do have the CO and are able to use it.

On August 29th The Collide Center hosted the Tech Cocktail Dallas event. It was attended by nearly 225 people and was a wonderful success. The Tech Cocktail group has already asked us if we would like to host the 2014 events in May and August.
