Heather is an exceptional human being who is a single mom, caring for a five year old and a twelve year old. She does so all the while giving back to the community at large, through her love and commitment to her family, her community and all who live daily with special needs and the challenges that go along with this.

Heather is the mom of a beautiful daughter who was born with Down Syndrome. Early on, she realized that there were not many events or resources available for these wonderful "differently challenged" with human beings and decided that she wanted to create an organization that was committed to providing events and opportunities where those with special needs in the McKinney area could attend, enjoy at their own pace and not be judged, hurried or looked upon as different. Heather founded the non-profit, "Especially Needed" in June of 2010. Through this organization she has established numerous events and venues for this to happen!

She has successfully established key programs to benefit and serve those who otherwise might not have the opportunity to enjoy what we at times so easily take for granted. She has even made sure that adults with special needs are allowed the opportunity to attend and not be overlooked.

Some of her accomplishments are as follows:

- 1. <u>Annual Fall Carnival</u>: At this event each year over 300 families, with special needs children are able to attend and enjoy an evening of carnival games, petting zoo, foods, rides, trick or treating and fireworks!

 But Heather doesn't stop there. She also invites the local Adult Special Care facility, realizing that many adults who are in actuality children themselves, need to have a safe, fun, non-judgmental venue in which to have fun and be themselves.
- 2. <u>Annual Easter Eqa Hunt</u>: More than 200 families each year attend and enjoy egg hunting, visits with the Easter Bunny, face pointing, games and events all geared towards children and adults with special needs. She even went to Home Depot and asked them to help her to create a special wand with magnets so that those in wheel chairs could also enjoy the activities by picking up eggs with magnets attached. She doesn't believe in leaving anyone out! She was highlighted on Good Morning Texas, interviewing her about this unique event.

3. <u>A Special Time With Santa</u>: At this event more than 140 families bring their children with special needs and enjoy an evening with Santa. (But not just any Santa.) A Santa who understands the need to be compassionate, understanding and the ability to cater to the individual differences and needs of these amazing members of our community. Heather made sure of this.

As stated before, Heather manages all of this while being a single mom and supporting her two children. She does not take no for an answer and will leave no stone unturned in her quest to allow these individuals the same opportunities as others and enhance their quality of life day by day, event by event.

She applied for grants though the City Of McKinney Community Development Corporation and was successful in garnering some funds for these events, but still spends much of her own money, to cover the expenses.

She worked closely with the Kiwanis Club of McKinney to initiate the startup of the Angel League Halos Teball team for young children with special needs in 2010 and it is still going strong.

She organized and led a cheer camp for children with special needs at the McKinney Community Center in 2012.

Heather firmly believes ALL should be afforded equal opportunities to enjoy an equal quality of life. Thus her belief in providing these opportunities and helping to ensure that the City of McKinney does indeed stand behind all their citizens and share her beliefs. She is proud of her family, her community and her organization, as we all should be.

Heather was nominated for and chosen as one of 6 winners of the at Morgan's Wonderland of San Antonio Texas. The world's largest theme park for special needs individuals. In 2010, Astuto founded the non-profit Especially Needed organization to offer year-round special events for special-needs children and adults in the McKinney area. The events include a fall carnival, A Special Time with Santa, an Easter egg hunt, the Super Owls summer camp and monthly birthday parties. She also worked closely with the Kiwanis Club of McKinney to start up the Angel League Halos T-ball team for younger children with special needs. Grants and gifts help Astuto stage the various events; however she oftentimes spends her own money to cover expenses in order not to disappoint families who really look forward to the various activities. She accomplishes

all that she does as a single mom, caring for a 5-year-old daughter and a 13-year-old daughter with Down syndrome.

This past year she was recently highlighted in the DfwChild and Thrive magazines for her accomplishments and programs she has instituted to improve the quality of life for those with challenges in her community.

We have learned that there are some outcomes that are even too large or meaningful to be measured, such as a child's smile who is in a wheel chair and could not bend and pick up an egg, but now can actually hunt along with others or even a child who must walk at her own pace and would normally be overrun by other children and not even have a chance to enjoy the experience of "hunting for eggs" or a child who for the first time got to REALLY TALK to Santa and believe that he understood, or a 32 year old adult who is attending an Easter Egg Hunt for the very first time and is so excited over his treasures. These are things that truly CHANGE quality of life. All of these activities help to showcase that the City of McKinney truly does embrace all and much of this is due to Heather's tireless diligence to improve the life of her daughter and all others who face challenges every day.

Stories from Refugio: Candido

While 70% of Refugio evacuated, Candido Porras decided to ride out the storm in his travel trailer, located on seven acres south of Refugio. He had lived on this land, left to him by his father, for less than a year after losing his house in Woodsboro to back taxes in December of 2016.

Twelve days after the storm hit, he was without power and unable to operate his breathing machine. When the Minuteman team learned of his need, they immediately went to a hardware store in nearby Beeville and purchased a generator and heavy-duty power cords to ensure the equipment could be operated safely.



The next day, they made the drive out to his property, turning off the main highway onto a pot-hole ridden dirt road that took them back in time. Several trees were down, but they finally came upon the small clearing where Candido's trailer was situated, between old storage buildings that had toppled in the storm.

Candido led the way to his trailer, his face beaming with every step as he helped Minuteman's executive director, Matt Payne, and Jared Stump (a volunteer from Pennsylvania) unload the generator from their truck and place it next to his trailer, where it would power his breathing machine and window-unit air conditioner.

"You rode out the storm here?" Jared asked, pointing to the aging trailer.



"Yup!" Candido replied. "There were people concerned about me, but I tell 'em, 'l'm tough as leather.' They offered to take me into town, but I wanted to stay with my dogs," he said, pointing to a fenced enclosure that held five dogs, with a few more roaming outside the enclosure. "This is my kitchen over here," Candido said proudly, pointing to a propane tank that was situated in the dirt next to a washing machine. "That's where I do my laundry."

As Candido talked Matt fired up the generator, restoring power to Candido's trailer for the first time in twelve days. He continued to talk to the team for half an hour and showed them the inside of his trailer. "Part of my roof was ripped off and water came pouring in—it was like a waterfall inside my house!" he said with a smile.

"And you were here the whole time?" Jared asked again.

"Yup!" Candido replied. "My son-in-law stayed, too. He lives in town. He should have evacuated, but he wanted to stay and help [after the storm]."

Matt showed Candido how to work the generator, and told him it was his for as long as he had need of it. "If you can use it, I don't need it back," he said, but Candido shook his head. "I don't want to take it away when there may be someone else who will need it. I'll just keep it until the power comes back on, then I'll give you a call."

Jared explained that there were churches in Oklahoma and New Jersey that had taken special collections to raise the money that purchased the generator, among other supplies that were needed in Refugio.

"Wow," Candido replied, nodding. "I heard of churches in Mississippi, Ohio, and Idaho that sent help. It makes me want to cry."

As Matt and Jared concluded there time with Candido he thanked them for their help. "It's nice to get back to some ... what's the word?" he



paused for a moment, searching for the right word. "Normalacy," he said with a smile. "You guys have a blessed day," he said as they got back into the truck. "I know i did—I'm still here!"

PROFILE: Minuteman Disaster Response director Matt Payne

Aug 21, 2017



Minuteman Disaster Response has become known for its value to communities in need. The organization, which responds to areas hit by natural disasters, is helmed by former pastor Matt Payne, who joined its ranks after Councilwoman Tracy Rath's resignation in 2015.

Since then, Minuteman has grown in manpower, resources and equipment. We sat down with Payne to talk about what's new.

What does Minuteman Disaster Response do?

We're a nonprofit that's driven by volunteers - we have about 100 volunteers on our team - and our mission is to serve victims and first responders after natural disasters. We don't just serve McKinney or just Collin County, but we actually serve Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas and Louisiana.

How did it get started?

We've been around since 2011. It was originally formed by Paul Pogue and a few other gentlemen who when up to Joplin after the tornado to deliver some supplies for their church. See that kind of drove them to say, 'We can and want to do something more,' so it developed over time into where we are today.

How far has it come since then?

We have about 30 members on our Rapid Response Team. They are trained to do search and rescue type of work, medical ops, drones - these types of things - in the early hours after a disaster. This past year, we launched our Relief Team, and that's where we partner with churches and businesses around the region where you've got folks who want to go out and help after disaster and they don't know where to go. Let us train those people and deploy them when it's needed. That has been really successful. We just this past spring brought on about 70 new members through that, and we're getting really to launch it in Tulsa this fall. And we'll have ongoing training here in McKinney as well.

What sets you apart?

Where our organization is kind of different ... if I use Canton as a perfect example, that storm happened on Saturday evening, our Storm Warn Team was already in field tracking that storm. They were just outside of Van Zandt County when that storm went through, so that allows us to be on site within an hour after a storm hits. The first three days we served with our Response Team doing search work, then we spent another seven days on the ground with our Relief Team.

How do you handle deployments?

Or organization's very big about being self-sufficient in the field, so everything we do we try to strive to not be a burden to the community. We go there completely as volunteers. It's all donated resources, we don't ask for anything back. We have a 46-food command trailer that we work out of the first couple of days, and we can sleep our guys in there as well. Then, Day 2-3, we have a 40-foot bunkhouse that comes out that's three rooms, air-conditioned, where we can sleep about 20 team members on the ground. We also have a 32-foot shower/restroom trailer that has six private shower and restroom stalls. It's all about being able to take care of ourselves. It wouldn't be the best if we took 100 people into a community and ate up hotel rooms where people may need those that live in that community.

How long have you been involved?

I got involved back in 2012 as volunteer. I was an associate pastor at a church here in town, and my role was outreach and missions so it was a great fit for me. I would volunteer and went on deployments with them quite a bit. In 2015 when I stepped away from my role at the church was the same time Tracy Rath was director. When she won the election, she needed to step down from the role and that was at the same time I was trying to figure out my next place, so I stepped in.

What types of events have you responded to?

If you look at our list of deployments, the majority of it is tornados. We served Bastrop with the fire one year by hauling some supplies down there, but it's predominantly tornados because of where we live. There have not been any hurricanes make landfall on the coast since we've been together. We did go down to Baton Rouge with the flooding that took place last summer, but it was more of an exploratory mission to do some recon and make our resources available.

What are some of the local deployments you've been on?

We spent three days in Rowlett working with that community. We came home Monday night, then Wednesday we went to Farmersville and worked with the county. We brought out a lot of heavy equipment and helped do a some of the cleanup. We serve the city in any way they need. We regularly support them with a rehab facility at the Red, White and Boom.



What types of people volunteer with Minuteman?

All different types - from retire firefighters, military to guys who are still working. We have guys who are in sales, guys that are engineers – just a variety of people that get involved. The Response Team is made up of men for the most part, because of the nature of it and how we have to house up. The Relief Team is open to anybody 18 and up.
