

ESPECIALLY NEEDED's 1st Annual

"Celebrating Our Differences" Family Fun Event at The Ballfields at Craig Ranch

1. The mission of Especially Needed is to build a strong community where individuals with special needs are valued, respected and included. This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable purposes as specified in Section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code.

The purpose of this corporation is:

- Offer community events, workshops and literature to better educate people in the community on the types of disabilities as well as proper communication and how to eliminate prejudices and discrimination against the special needs population.
- Host several events and activities throughout the year in a fun, loving and stress free
 environment where individuals with developmental and intellectual disabilities and their families are
 included and treated equally.
- Provide quality educational programs and services at a minimum or no cost to the individual or family with a disability.
- Provide an outlet of resources and information for families and individuals to ensure that people
 with special needs are aware of all the services that are being offered to them and their families.

Families come from all over North Dallas and the Collin County to the City of McKinney to attend our special events. The organization was formed a little over 4 years ago and we put a great amount of time and effort into these events. We are constantly spreading the word to as many families as possible. Our current list of families is over 800 and is growing. About 35% of the families are from McKinney, another 30% from Frisco, 15% from Allen, 10% Plano and the remaining 10 percent are from cities further than 30 miles from McKinney.

The event for which our organization is requesting funds:

1st Annual "Celebrating Our Differences" Family Fun Community Event

II. Event outline and details:

This event will be held on October 4^{th} , 2014 at The Ballfields at Craig Ranch. The target audience will be families from McKinney and surrounding cities. This will be our first event that is open to everyone and not just individuals with special needs and their families. The main purpose of this event is to bring awareness to the community regarding how many families locally are differently abled and also how to stop bullying and recognize that we are unique and different.

This will be our first year to hold this event but based on attendance from our past events we would expect around 5,000-10,000 people to attend. We assume that if 1,000 people attend our events that are limited to families with special needs then we can estimate that 5-10K will attend this event since it is open to everyone. Also, because it is bringing awareness to a topic many people can empathize with (having a special need, being different, having a family member who is "different" and for those who have been bullied because they are different or have a special needs). We would expect 50% of attendance will be McKinney Families, 30% Frisco and the remaining 20% would be families from Plano, Allen and other surrounding cities based on past events.

Just like all of our events, because of dozens of volunteers within the community and contributions from sponsors, the event will be completely FREE to attend! Food will be available for purchase onsite and tickets will be required for some activities.

Some of the planned activates are:

There will be something for everyone at this "Celebrating our Differences" family fun event.

We plan to have a great entertainment lineup with local talent and a musical acts (Emerald City Band could be main show) all leading up to and amazing fireworks display (possibly sponsored by Angels of Care). Various vendors will be onsite for awesome food and beverage needs. Kids can enjoy bounce houses and play structures in the Kid Zone and get creative with crafts at our craft tents.

We will be reaching out to McKinney Key Clubbers as well as PALS group (Peer Assistance Leadership Program) in MISD and surround ISD's to offer teen friendly games and booths to talk about how to stop bullying.

We also plan to have Hi Profile speakers to talk about bullying and/or sign autographs.

A full schedule plus other important information such as parking, activities and sponsor information will be available via our website and will be user friendly.

How this event will advance the mission and strategic goals of MCDC and how it will impact the community.

By hosting an event that brings awareness to something that a large portion of our community deals with on a daily basis as well as promoting inclusion we strengthening our community and providing a fun concert event (which is an amenities to McKinney) and improves quality of life

Families with children who have special needs will consider moving their residence to McKinney because we advocate for individuals with special needs which contributes to business and economic development by increasing our population within McKinney

Attracting out of town visitors to our city

Several members of our community either have a family member with special needs or they have a friend, coworker or they know someone with a special need. Also, several families in McKinney and surrounding cities support Especially Needed and our initiates and would attend an event like this. Therefore, several families from Frisco, Allen, Plano and other surrounding cities would be attending this event.

Not only unique by nature; this event is very unique.

I have never seen an event like this. Our organization has been contacted by several businesses that are interested in helping with future events or becoming sponsors because there are not many organization (can't think of any) in the North Dallas area that focuses on events specifically for the special needs community.

Promotes a sense of inclusion in the community which in turn enhances the quality of life in McKinney for families with special needs.

We will be bring awareness to the bullying issue that is being faced nationwide which will have a positive impact on MISD and decrease the chances of bullying.

According to abilitypath.org:

"Research conducted has demonstrated conclusively that children with disabilities are significantly more likely than their peers to be the victims of bullying. The statistical rate of bullying for this demographic is wide ranging. A study in the British Journal of Learning Support (2008) found that 60 percent of students with disabilities reported being bullied compared to 25 percent of the general student population. According to researchers Wall, Wheaton and Zuver (2009) only 10 studies have been conducted in the United States on bullying and developmental disabilities. All studies found that children with disabilities were two to three times more likely to be victims of bullying than their non-disabled peers. In addition, the researchers found that the bullying experienced by these children was more chronic in nature and was most often directly

related to their disability.

In a landmark study conducted in 1994, researchers found that children with visible physical conditions or disabilities, such as cerebral palsy and Down syndrome, are more likely to be called names or aggressively excluded from social activities (Olweus, 1994). Other researchers have discovered that students with 11disabilities were more worried about school safety and being injured or harassed by peers, compared to students without a disability (Saylor & Leach, 2009).

In 2009, the Massachusetts Advocates for Children in a survey of nearly 400 parents of children with autism across the state found that 88 percent of children with autism have been bullied at school ranging from

verbal abuse to physical contact.

In Connecticut, Julie Swanson, an advocate for families with special needs and her colleague, Jennifer Laviano an attorney in private practice who represents children and families with special needs, joined forces with other parents to persuade the State Department of Education, to begin to track the number of incidents of bullying and the child with special needs. Julie stated that while there is no "official" data being kept on the incidence of bullying among kids with disabilities, the incoming call data reflected a disturbing trend: more than 50 percent of the complaints involved a student with an IEP, or a disability. The unofficial conclusion is that there is a disturbing, disproportionate occurrence of bullying among students with disabilities.
