 - historian;
 - licensed real estate broker;
 - attorney;
 - property owner of a landmark or of a building in a historic district.




HPAB Role

- Adopt rules for meetings
- Maintain written minutes of meetings
- Conduct Surveys of historic properties
- Recommend landmarks and criteria for identifying landmarks
- Recommend recognition of historic properties via markers, plaques, certificates
- Increase public awareness of Historic Preservation by supporting Staff programs
- Make recommendations to Council on the use of funds to promote Preservation
- Recommend acquisition of landmark structures by city for preservation
- Recommend guidelines for review of landmarks and districts
- Approve and deny historic markers in the HNIZ program
- Review CoAs as forwarded from Staff
