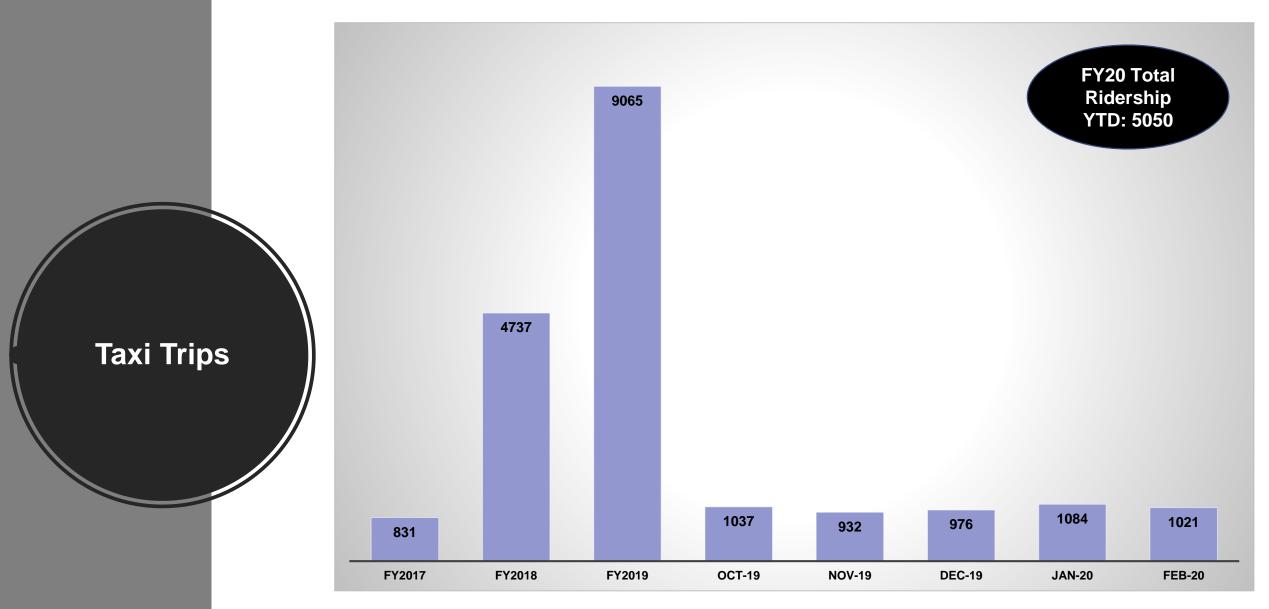

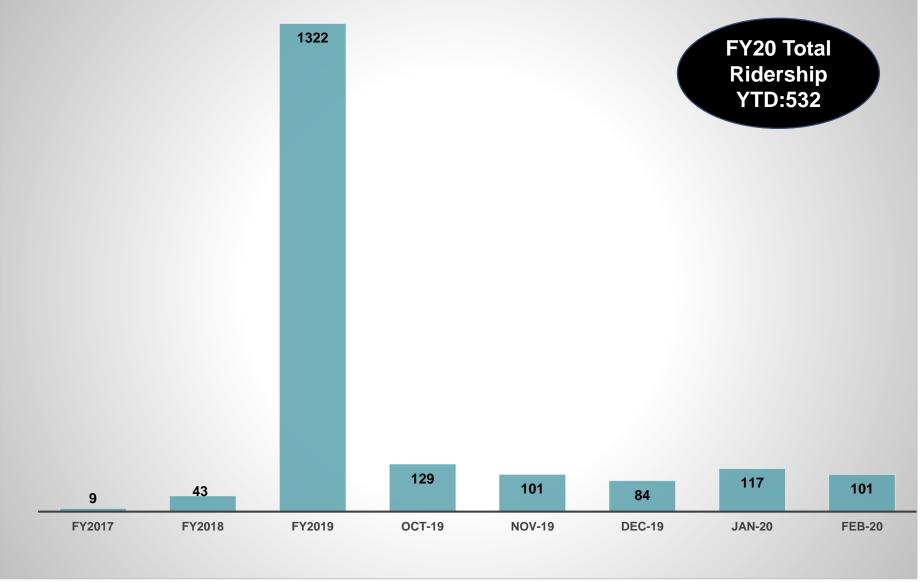

January 31, 2019 - Country Lane, Grand Texan and Grand Reserve

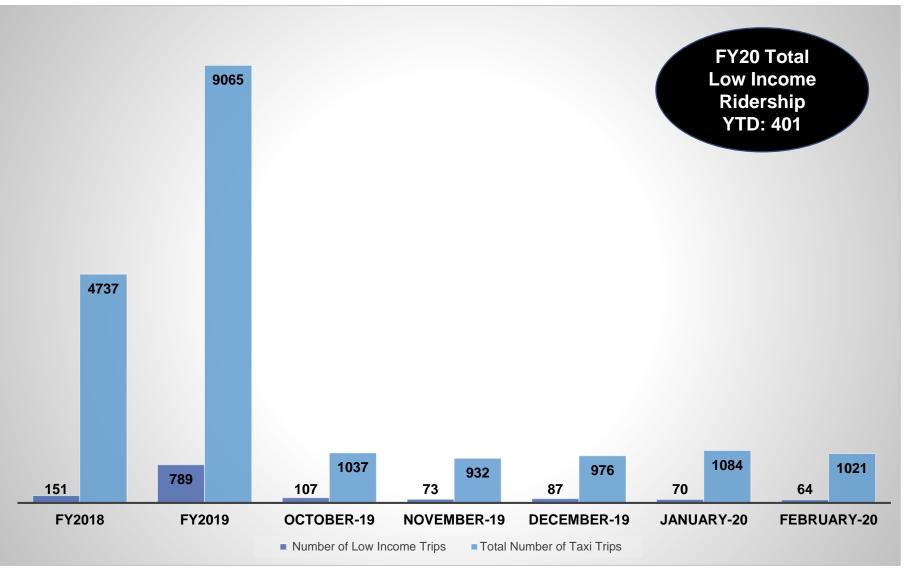

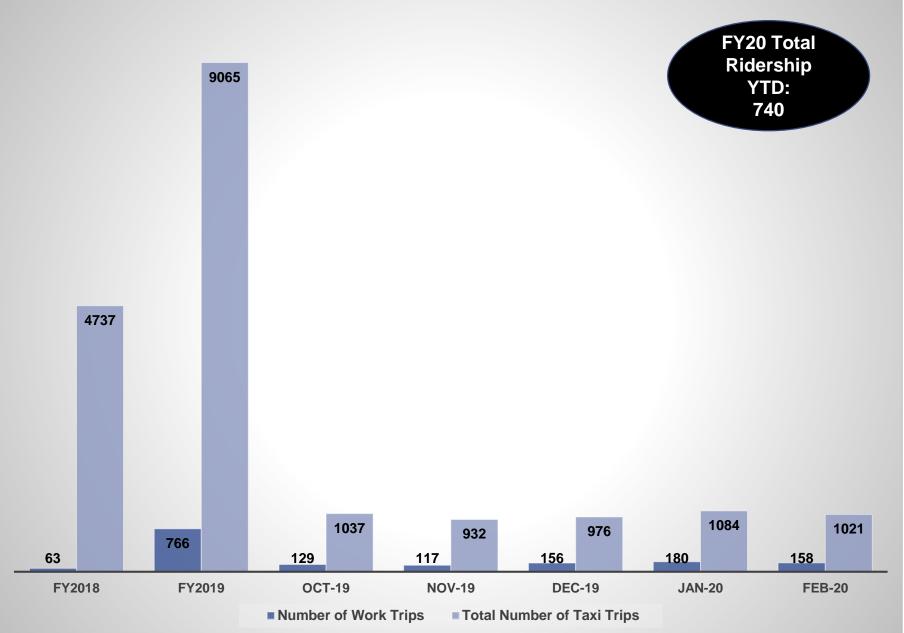
