2013-14 Final Grant Report Narrative

Music in Motion 2013 once again offered great music and beautiful art. The Guild chose not to sell tickets (or dogtags) as planned, but rather to offer the event free, with a suggested donation in exchange for a dogtag that announced the event. The dogtags were circulated by members well in advance of the event. Held at Chestnut Square, there were good numbers of people throughout the day, until the rain came and drove the musicians inside the Chapel. All total, we had approximately 400 guests and participants. The musicians and artists always enjoy this event in McKinney, and commit to participating in future events planned by the Guild because of the fun they have at Music in Motion.

Because we chose not to have alcohol at Music in Motion, the monies budgeted for permits and security were set aside to be used at April, when the Guild added a professional jazz quartet to the annual Arts in Bloom festival in downtown McKinney. The music was terrific, and had people dancing on the courthouse lawn, literally.

In June, the Guild hosted the Summer Music Intensives. Every afternoon for two weeks, 15-30 music students, beginner to advanced, ages 6-16, came to the Heard-Craig Center for the Arts for intense aural training, music theory, and jam sessions in bluegrass, blues and jazz. The faculty of seven professionals worked with individuals and small groups on the art of improvisation. Everyday the students were encouraged not only to read the notes of the music, but to listen to each other and respond and play beyond the line of music. Surrounded by 2-3 professional musicians playing beside them at all times, each session was a total immersion in music making. Most of these students needed substantial scholarships. The ethnic and socio-economic diversity represented by the group was gratifying. The Guild said "yes" to every parent requesting financial aid. The fruits of everyone's efforts were shared with the community during a final student-faculty concert, which we offered free to the public. The attendance was outstanding
