2013 Summer Music Intensives June 10-21 & July 8-19, M-F afternoons, Heard-Craig Public Performances June 21st and July 19th

June session: Students: 14 jr. and sr. high kids and 1 adult

Attendance at Performance: 130

July session: Students: 14 jr. and sr. high kids and 1 adult

Attendance at Performance: 90

Parents were overwhelmingly grateful for the opportunity for their kids to study with the caliber of teachers in our program. Parents and students recognized the value of learning to play and improvise in small ensembles. Audiences at the performances were very enthusiastic.

Instruments taught: guitar, fiddle, cello, bass, keyboard, sax

drums and percussion, voice, flute, bass clarinet

Musical genres/improvisations: jazz, blues, bluegrass, folk

Thanks in great part to the low cost of the program, students included one special needs child and several sets of siblings.

Our teachers came from across DFW. Their range of expertise and degree of commitment to our program created an exciting learning environment. Many returned from last year's pilot program, and all have expressed an interest in next summer's program.

Excellent connections were made through the Intensives. Several of the professional musicians, who came to know each other by teaching in our program, are now performing together around the metroplex. Even more exciting is the fact that a few of the more advanced students have been offered the chance to perform at gigs with the professional musicians who taught at the Intensives.

Some of our teachers and students will be performing at Music in Motion, October 5th.

Joe Allan, who volunteered approx. 80 hours to handle logistics and security throughout the Intensives, and Jerry Rizzi, the bass and cello teacher in the program, are developing an ongoing improvisational youth ensemble in McKinney. This will be a musical outlet unlike any other in the city.

We have been approached by members of Frisco's music community to begin this program in Frisco.
