




The mission of the Children's Advocacy Center of Collin County is to provide safety, healing and justice to victims of child abuse






Today, Collin County's population is just over one million residents. By 2050, Collin County's population is expected to surpass 3.8 million.





Population growth is based on area school district projections. The size of each bubble represents the number of children in the school district.






BUILDING PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

- New Facility will house all members of the Multi-Disciplinary Team, and will serve Northern Collin County
- Capital Campaign was launched in January 2018 to raise \$10M, the estimated cost for the project at that time
- Land at 380 and Central was made available for the facility at a deeply discounted price
- KDC is providing Project Manager services on a pro-bono basis
- The Capital Campaign was completed successfully in fall of 2020, with 100% participation by Board, Advisory Council and CACCC staff members
- Building was designed by Alliance Architects and Spring Valley Construction is the General Contractor
- Construction began July 1, 2021, and the new facility will be fully operational by late summer 2022
