~~AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2010-05-014, ORDAINING THE CITY OF MCKINNEY'S CONTINUED PARTICIPATION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MCKINNEY, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF MCKINNEY TO PARTICIPATE~~ IN THE TEXAS ENTERPRISE ZONE PROGRAM PURSUANT TO THE TEXAS ENTERPRISE ZONE ACT, CHAPTER 2303, TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE (ACT), PROVIDING ADDITIONAL POTENTIAL BUSINESS AND TAX INCENTIVES, DESIGNATING A LIAISON FOR COMMUNICATION WITH THE INTERESTED PARTIES, AND NOMINATING RAYTHEON COMPANY TO THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND TOURISM (OOGEDT) THROUGH THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT BANK (BANK) AS A TEXAS ENTERPRISE PROJECT (PROJECT)

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of MCKINNEY, Texas (the "City") desires to create the proper economic and social environment to induce the investment of private resources in productive business enterprises located in- distressed areas of the City and to provide employment to residents of such areas; and

WHEREAS, the Project is not located in an area designated as an enterprise zone; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 2303, Subchapter F of the Act, **RAYTHEON COMPANY** has applied to the City for designation as a Texas Enterprise Project; and

WHEREAS, the City finds that **RAYTHEON COMPANY** meets the criteria for tax relief and other incentives adopted by the City on the grounds that it will be located at the qualified business site, will create a higher level of employment, economic activity and stability; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing to consider this ordinance was held by the City Council on January 19, 2016.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MCKINNEY, TEXAS THAT:

- Section 1. The City nominates **RAYTHEON COMPANY** for Enterprise Project status.
- Section 2. The local incentives identified and summarized briefly in the attached **Exhibit A**, at the election of the governing body, are or will be made available to the nominated Project or activity of the qualified business site.
- Section 3. The enterprise zone areas within the City are reinvestment zones in accordance with the Texas Tax Code, Chapter 312.
- Section 4. The McKinney City Council directs and designates the City Manager or his designee as the City's liaison to communicate and negotiate with the OOGEDT through the Bank and enterprise project(s) and to oversee enterprise zone activities and communications with qualified businesses and other entities in an enterprise zone or affected by an enterprise project.
- Section 5. The City finds that **RAYTHEON COMPANY** meets the criteria for designation as an enterprise project under Chapter 2303, Subchapter F of the Act on the following grounds:
 - (a.) **RAYTHEON COMPANY** is a "qualified business" under Section 2303.402 of the Act since it will be engaged in the active conduct of a trade or business at a qualified business site within the governing body's jurisdiction, located outside of an enterprise zone and at least thirty-five percent (35%) of the business' new employees will

be residents of an enterprise zone, or veterans, or economically disadvantaged individuals; and

- (b.) There has been and will continue to be a high level of cooperation between public, private, and neighborhood entities in the area; and
- (c.) The designation of **RAYTHEON COMPANY** as a Texas Enterprise Project will contribute significantly to the achievement of the plans of the City for development and revitalization of the area.

Section 6. The Enterprise Project shall take effect on the date of designation of the enterprise project by the OOGEDT and terminate after five (5) years after such date.

Section 7: This ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage.
