## McKinney Community Development Corporation Meeting of the Promotional and Community Event Grant Subcommittee January 19, 2022

The McKinney Community Development Corporation Promotional and Community Event Grants Committee met at 4:30 p.m. on January 19, 2021, in the MCDC offices at 5900 S. Lake Forest Blvd., Ste. 110, McKinney, Texas.

**MCDC board members present:** Vice Chair Kathryn McGill, Secretary David Kelly and Treasurer Mary Barnes-Tilley.

**Staff present:** President Cindy Schneible and Administrative and Marketing Coordinator Linda Jones.

President Schneible shared that total grant requests for Cycle I are \$130,470, and our budget is \$100,000.

Factors considered for each grant application included:

- Ability to showcase the City of McKinney for purposes of business development and tourism;
- Anticipated attendance from McKinney residents and visitors to the city; and
- Number of events supported by a single grant.

After detailed discussion of each grant application, the sub-committee unanimously agreed to recommend a total of \$100,000 in grant awards as follows:

- 25 Revolutions, LLC (22-01) requested \$15,000 for promotion of a feature-length documentary set in McKinney. The subcommittee recommends funding of \$9,500.
- Heritage Guild (22-02) requested \$13,865 for promotion of 2022 events including but not limited to Farmers Market, Educational Programming, Murder Mystery, Farm Fresh Dinner and Bar Wars. The subcommittee recommends funding of \$12,000.
- SBG Hospitality (22-03) requested \$15,000 for promotion of the 2022 Sip & Stroll
   Series. The subcommittee recommends funding of \$10,000.
- Ovation Academy (22-04) requested \$12,000 for promotion of Spring/Summer productions. The subcommittee recommends funding of \$5,000.

- Kiwanis Club of McKinney (22-06) requested \$3,000 for promotion of the 2022
   Triathlon. The subcommittee recommends funding of \$3,000.
- MillHouse Foundation requested \$5,005 for promotion of 2022 arts festivals. The subcommittee recommends funding of \$5,000.
- St. Peter's Episcopal Church (22-07) requested \$9,500 for promotion of 2022
   Empty Bowls. The subcommittee recommends funding of \$8,500.
- DFW Series (22-08) requested \$3,000 for promotion of the 2022 DFW Series to include 17 off-road cycling events hosted at Erwin Park. The subcommittee recommends funding of \$3,000.
- ManeGait Therapeutic Horsemanship (22-09) requested \$10,000 for promotion of the 2022 Country Fair (Live at the 'Gait). The subcommittee recommends funding of \$7,500.
- McKinney Chamber of Commerce (22-10) requested \$15,000 for promotion of the 2022 McKinney Made initiative. The subcommittee recommends funding of \$12,000.
- Collin County History Museum (22-11) requested \$10,000 for promotion of the 2022 Then and Now Exhibit and events. The subcommittee recommends funding of \$7,500.
- Holy Family School (22-12) requested \$7,100 for promotion of Black History Month
  educational programming to include a pop-up museum and shuttle tours through
  Finch Park, Ross Cemetery and Doty High School. The subcommittee
  recommends funding of \$5,000.
- McKinney Main Street (22-13) requested \$12,000 for Arts in Bloom and 2022
   Juneteenth events. The subcommittee recommends funding of \$12,000.

Treasurer Barnes-Tilley will present these recommendations to the MCDC Board at the month Board meeting on January 27, 2022.
