MPF Functions

- Organizes volunteers to help with projects in conjunction with the McKinney PROS Department
- Provides a structure for organizing educational opportunities about the natural environment
- Plan stewardship projects monthly at Community Center Trail and McKinney Greens Nature Preserve
- Received Monarch Watch grant of 500 milkweed plants to be planted next month in MG by volunteers
- Recipient of \$51,000 grant from Bonneville Environmental Foundation to plant 1600 trees along Wilson Creek in MG in November 2021



Volunteer Efforts

- Since 2017 = **3800+ volunteer hours**
 - The organization Independent Sector estimates that the value of volunteer time for 2021 was \$28.54 per hour

 $3847 \text{ hrs } \times \$28.54 = \$109,793 \text{ to McKinney parks}$

To date: 550+ volunteers have worked with the MPF
