- Concept began in 1986 (IAFC and ICMA)
 (Related) Texas Fire Chief's Association Best Practices as preparation
- Non profit 501 (C)(3)
- Professional credentialing for Fire Departments and Chief Officers
- Expanded in scope to include other areas of public safety



- Improve organizational performance and potential ISO rating
- Reduce organizational risk
 - ✓ Define fire risk and hazards
 - ✓ Define community vulnerabilities
 - ✓ Develop comprehensive plans to address issues
- Enhance budget management and "bottom-line"



- •The process:
- Evaluates performance based on industry benchmarks
- Identifies specific strengths and weaknesses for on-going development.
- Creates a response coverage model or Standard of Cover for resource allocation and deployment
- Long term strategic plan
- Justification of expenditures



Cost and expenditures:

- Typically takes 18 months
- Initial full time Accreditation Manager, then maintenance
- Initial fee at contract \$7.7K for application; \$7.5K for site visit
- Annual fee \$1.5K
- Re-accred. every 5 years (on-going daily process)



Conclusion:

The value of Fire Service Accreditation includes:

- Determine community risk and safety needs.
- Evaluate the performance of the department.
- Establish a method for achieving continuous organizational improvement and professional development.
