#### SUMMARY

Erwin Park is destined to be one of the celebrated park landscapes in the City of McKinney. Its storied legacy of prairie-to-agriculture-to-prairie is a unique story of man's relationship with the environment. It is also a story that should not be lost in the ongoing suburban development of North Central Texas, but should be preserved and interpreted for generations to come.

Defined by the creek and its western tributaries, Erwin Park was originally part of the vast Blackland Prairie that covered most of North Central Texas. This rich soil was home to roaming herds of bison and pronghorn antelope that sought out the tallgrass prairie grasses of little bluestem, big bluestem, Indiangrass, switch grass, sideoats grama, and hairy grama. The Erwin family acquired the property in the 1870's and operated a small cattle farm. The land remained in the family until 1971.

Dr. & Mrs. J.C. Erwin Jr. dedicated the land to the City of McKinney in 1971 to forever be preserved as a public park. Various park improvements were constructed over the following thirty years and the park came to be known as a destination for mountain biking, camping, and other outdoor recreation activities.

In the spring of 2007, the city commissioned a new master plan for the park. The landscape architectural planning team conducted a thorough experiential analysis that defined a number of zones in the park. These zones represent how the site is cognitively understood by visitors and how they engage with various spaces within the park. The team also prepared an environmental sensitivity analysis that assessed the natural systems of the site (hydrology, slopes, soils, and vegetation), and mapped the property according to development impact on these systems. Finally, a programming inventory and assessment were conducted, testing the current and proposed park programming against the findings of the previous analyses.

The master planning team compiled these studies with public comments and further input from city officials. These findings were the foundation upon which to build the master plan. The master plan for Erwin Park capitalizes upon the rich landscape legacy of the site. It envisions a healthy restored blackland prairie that is home to numerous plant and animal species. This precious natural resource will only become more scarce in the suburban landscape of the metroplex and is sure to become a popular interpretive and recreational destination. The plan divides the property into three parts: The Nature Area, The Nature Center, and The Nature Park.

The Nature Area envisions recreational trails through the prairie landscape. Concrete trails will attract numerous joggers and bikers and connect with the regional trail system. Other elements include the Events Lawn and a Day Camp.

The Nature Center proposes an environmental education station that interprets the prairie and teaches visitors about the natural and agricultural legacy of the land. Demonstration gardens will include various themed plantings for educational purposes and aesthetic interest. An amphitheater will provide the city with an outdoor event venue for city celebrations.

The Nature Park is planned to be the primary nature education area of the park. It will be a sanctuary for birding and nature walks. Trails will be narrow and of soft materials. Interpretive signage and destination nodes will inform visitors of the endemic landscape and habitats of North Central Texas.

An overlay of sustainable "green" architecture and construction techniques will reinforce the educational aspects of this park destination. Each design decision will be tested to see how it affects the environmental, educational, and recreational goals for the park.

A suggested strategy for implementation is included in the final chapters of this document. Critical to the success of this plan will be a custom-designed prairie restoration plan that directly responds to the diverse conditions of the site.

The realization of this vision for Erwin Park demands a long term, phased, and dedicated approach. In order to ensure that the foundation of this master plan is easily phased, the design team has recorded the research and planning phases in this document to serve as a guide for years of improvements. Most importantly, it describes in detail how each project identified in the master plan is to be designed and implemented. All projects respond to the overarching goals of natural system restoration as an educational and recreational open space landmark for the City of McKinney.
