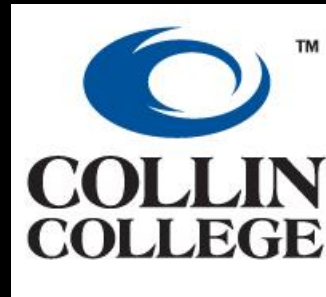

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Collin College is the only comprehensive training facility in Collin County to offer training for both fire and law enforcement.

- *Demonstrated performance*
- *Continuity of training*
 - *Consistent methodology throughout County*
 - *Benefits in mutual aid/automatic assistance*
- *Strong working relationship with City of McKinney and CC*
 - *Historical performance*
- *Optimal geographic location*
 - *Access to all stakeholders*
 - *Ability to return to service quickly*



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Facility taken out of service April 1, 2014. Without a facility, stakeholders are:

- Limited in ability to train in context*
- Limited in ability to provide live fire training locally*
- Limited in ability to provide specialized training*
- Limited in ability to keep resources local should significant emergency arise*
- Limited in ability to conduct multi-jurisdictional training evolutions*



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Training needs:

- *Texas Commission on Fire Protection Requirements*
- *Maintenance of ISO Class #1 public protection classification*
 - *Must have access to training facility with a building at least 4 stories in height.*
 - *Must have live fire training structure*
 - *Must conduct multi-company drills*
 - *Must conduct 8, 3-hour drills (50% can be classroom)*
 - *Must conduct 18 hours of training per firefighter per year at a training facility (for maximum credit)*
- *Internal requirements*
 - *Core competency; recruit training; driver training; officer training*
 - *MFD Strategic Plan*
 - *Reduce risk for injury*
 - *Multi-company; multi-jurisdictional drills for auto assist and mutual aid agreements*



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Benchmarks:

- *Prior to 2013* – Discussions between City and Collin College regarding joint training facility project in anticipation of relocation of Fire Training facility.
- *March, 2014* – No apparent solution.
- *March 4, 2014* – Council approves budget amendment for \$2.2m applied to Fire Training Tower.
- *April 1, 2014* – Collin College Training tower removed from service.
- *June, 2014* – Discussions resume with Collin College regarding joint project.
- *June 1, 2015* – Collin College signs Inter-local Agreement



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Key points:

- Indoor, virtual firearms training center (S.H.O.T.T. House)
- Two burn structures, including burn tower at least 4 stories in height, classroom, assorted amenities.
- Minimum 1000 hours aggregate facility time for MFD.
- First scheduling opportunity following Collin College.
- Multiple agencies with simultaneous access; less limiting.
- City may use MFD instructors.



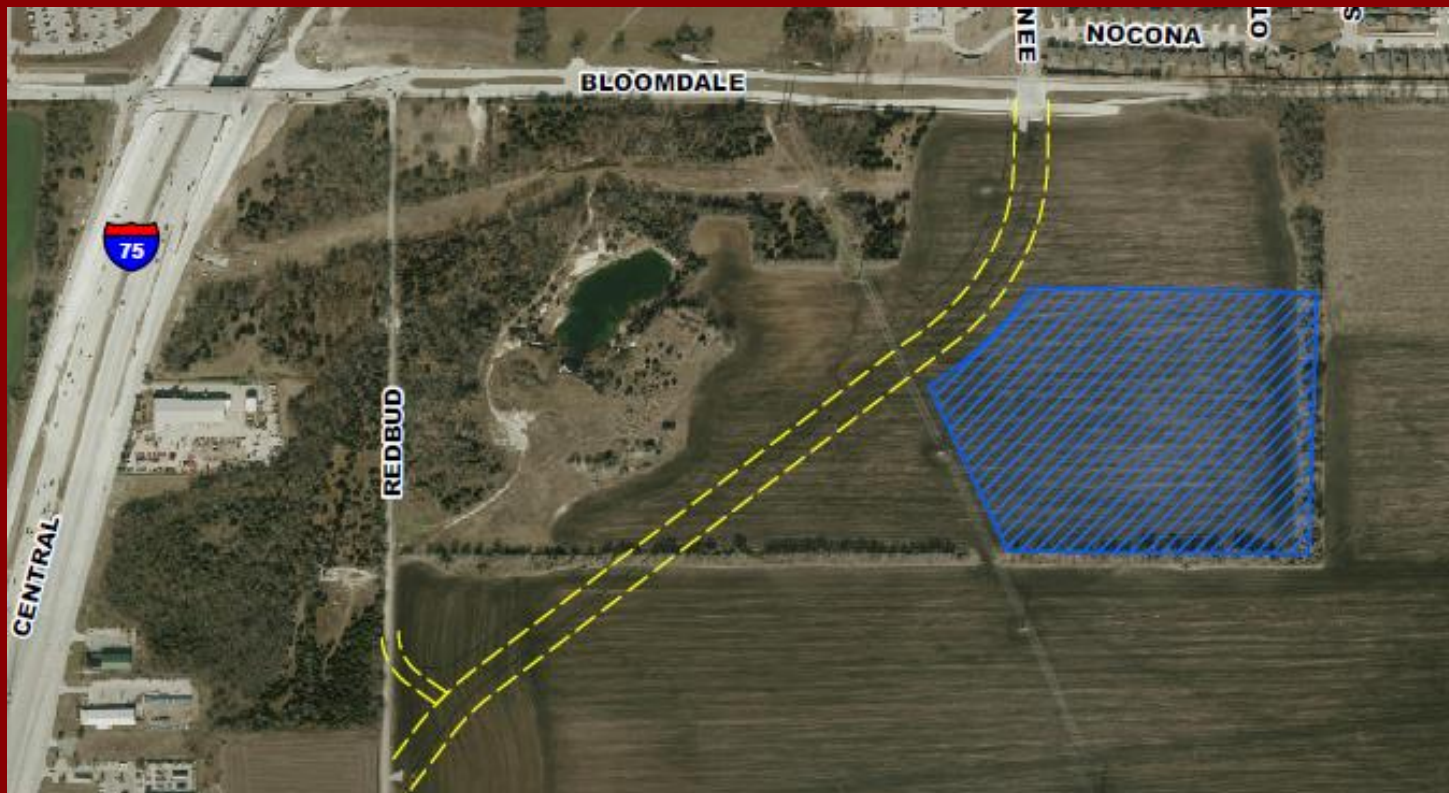
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City responsibility:

- Roadway and infrastructure to the site.
- Twenty-five acre site to lease.
- \$1.1m when College has expended 50% of total project cost.
- \$1.1m when CO issued.
