

- **WHEREAS**, a robust travel industry provides significant economic benefits for the nation, generating more than \$2.6 trillion in economic output in 2019, with \$1.1 trillion spent directly by travelers in the U.S., both domestic and international; and
- WHEREAS, travel has been the foundation of a healthy workforce, serving as one of the largest private-sector employers in the U.S., supporting 17 million jobs in 2019; and
- WHEREAS, travelers to and within Texas spent \$82.9 billion statewide in 2019, contributing \$4.7 billion in state taxes, positively impacting both state and local governments; and
- **WHEREAS.** last year, the coronavirus pandemic devastated every sector of the travel industry with staggering declines in 2020 compared to 2019, affecting every community in the country, including McKinney; and
- **WHEREAS**, without tourism dollars coming into our state, Texas households would each pay \$760 more in state and local taxes each year to maintain current levels of service; and
- **WHEREAS**, domestic travelers are showing an interest in traveling during 2021 and beyond, many opting for car travel to drivable destinations like McKinney, putting our community in a favorable place for increased economic impact from tourism; and
- WHEREAS, Visit McKinney continues to be a driver of economic development in this community, ending 2020 with hotel room revenue of \$20 million, which does not include visitor spending on food, beverage, fuel, and other purchases.
