Post Grant Narrative Summary

The Art Club of McKinney, in keeping with tradition, recently hosted two events concurrently March 18-20, 2016. The events, the 52nd Annual Collin County Adult Art Show, was held upstairs in the First United Methodist Church Banquet Hall (formerly, the Heard-Craig Hall) and the Annual Collin County Student Art Show was held downstairs in the same Hall.

The Adult portion of the show was open to all adult artists residing in Collin County or who are involved in an arts organization in Collin County. This event is one of the very few non-juried art shows in N. Texas, so even beginning artists could enter. The Student portion of the art show was open to all currently enrolled High School students in Collin County. Public, private and home-schooled students were eligible in entering.

The Adult show featured 142 art-works from 49 artists. Thirty-eight adult volunteers put in over 300 hours of labor from accepting and installing art works, manning the visitors tables, holding a reception and all the pre-show tasks like securing a facility, a judge and ribbons, preparing financials, advertising, writing a show prospectus and entering artist's entry forms.

The Student art show brought in 133 artists with 210 art works. The Student show was well run by 18 volunteers putting in almost 200 hours of labor, pre-show, show, and post-show. The First United Methodist Church Banquet Hall is a beautiful location that adds a level of prestige to our shows. The Adult show was particularly enhanced by being in the Grand Ballroom. Both the Adult and Student shows had a combined total of visitors around 900.

Our Adult show judge, David Collins, MFA, was given an especially difficult task. We decided to change our award format this year for the adult show. Instead of awarding 1st, 2nd, 3rd place awards in specific categories, all artwork competed for awards based on the principals of art and the elements of design. Some of the awards given were: Best Composition, Best Use of Rhythm/Movement, Best Use of Color, Best Functional Piece, Best Use of Line, Best Cityscape/Landscape.

Twenty-one awards plus a Best of Show and 10 Honorable Mentions were given out. The new awards offered a lot of excitement and fun!

The Student show, judged by Dr. Jeffrey Fontana, awarded 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in five categories of art-works, as well as the Mary Berry Award and Best of Show. Parents, art teachers and students were very excited about the show and expressed their gratitude in being able to compete in a local show.

Some of the comments overheard:

"The reception was just lovely, the art-work superb."

"Excellent show, the new awards categories opened up the judging to all types of art work."

"I loved how the art works were not grouped up by medium this year."

"I was surprised that so many people (over 125) showed up for the awards ceremony."

"This was my very first art show, thank-you for the opportunity."

"I was so amazed by the quality of the art work, and I loved the categories awarded."

"The student art work was unbelievable! I had no idea students were producing works like these."

"I loved hearing some of the critique type comments the judge said about the works. It was helpful in knowing how to change my work in the future!"

"This is the nicest art show I have seen in the Dallas area. It is beautifully laid out, and the awards ceremony and reception was lovely."

"I loved seeing that a traditional medium like quilting won Best of Show."

"The hostesses were fabulous in pointing out what some of the awards meant."

"I loved this show!"

"I loved that the judge honored both traditional realistic works along with abstract works. Sometimes judges favor one over the other."

The 52nd Annual Collin County Art Show was a huge success! We had an impressive turnout of artists who entered this year, which provided a broad range of art for our enthusiastic visitors.

The FUMC Auditorium was the perfect venue for our 2016 show! There was ample space to accommodate the response to our Call to Artists and all the support from the community.
