


The Davis-Hill house, is a one-and-a-half story, L- plan, Victorian home. The home was built for R.L. Davis, a local physician. In 1922, J.S. Hill became the owner and the home remained in the Hill family until 1968. It is one of the best preserved homes of this style in the City sporting jig-sawn brackets, sunburst motifs and imbricated shingles in the gables. The house is listed on the National Register and has a City of McKinney Historic Marker.

The house is a circa 1930, Tudor Revival, brick home. It was constructed as a duplex in order to provide an income for the family. The house has a slate roof with a centrally located fireplace. Limestone is used to trim around windows and doors. This particular style of house was introduced back into the U.S. by returning "Doughboys" from WWI who had been influenced by European architecture.

The Cline-Bass House is a circa 1895, modified L-plan dwelling with a large two-story addition to the front. The house was bought in 1902 by J.D. Bass, one of McKinney's most successful cotton brokers. He ran the city's most successful and longest operating, locally owned cotton brokerage houses.
