## Program Overview

### **Collin County Transit = Taxi Voucher Program + Supplemental Demand Response**

#### **Service**

Monday – Friday from 6 am to 6 pm & Saturdays from 8 am to 6 pm Trips provided within Collin County

### **Eligibility**

- 1. Resident of one of the participating cities; AND
- 2. Meets one of the following criteria:
  - ✓ Older Adult (65 + years)
  - ✓ Individual with a disability
  - ✓ Low Income

## Program Overview

Residents can apply by submitting the following information:

- Completed Application
- Copies of Required Eligibility Documentation
  - ✓ Proof of Residency
  - ✓ Proof of Age, Disability, or Income Status
- Signed Terms & Conditions

Completed applications can be returned to DCTA Customer Service by e-mail, fax, inperson, or mail

Application and supporting documentation reviewed to determine eligibility

### Program Overview

#### **Taxi Voucher Program**

- Once approved, customer calls Irving Holdings to request their debit card and add funds to their card
  - ✓ Funds can be added via Credit Card, Debit Card, Check, or Cash
- Customer's funds are matched 3:1
  - ✓ For every \$5 the customer adds to their card, an additional \$15 in McKinney UTD matching funds are added
- Cards are then mailed to the customer
- Customers can load up to \$150, for a total monthly value of \$600
- Customer calls Irving Holdings directly to schedule trip


