the City of McKinney, Texas is committed to ensuring the safety and security of all those living in

WHEREAS,	fire is a serious public safety concern both locally and nationally, and
WHEREAS,	in 2014, there were 1,298,000 fires reported in the United States. These fires caused 3,275 civilian deaths, 15,775 civilian injuries, and \$11.6 billion in property damage; and
WHEREAS,	Fire Prevention Week was established to commemorate the Great Chicago Fire, the tragic 1871 conflagration that killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless, destroyed more than 17,400 structures and burned more than 2,000 acres; and
WHEREAS,	during Fire Prevention Week, we pledge to take precautionary steps to stop fires before they start, and honor the sacrifices made by our Nation's courageous first responders who risk their lives to beat back these threats; and
WHEREAS,	McKinney's first responders are dedicated to reducing the occurrence of home fires, home fire injuries and home fire deaths through prevention and protection education; and
WHEREAS,	three out of five home fire deaths result from fires in properties without working smoke alarms; and
WHEREAS,	McKinney's residents should install smoke alarms in every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home; and

whereas, the 2016 Fire Prevention Week theme, "Don't Wait – Check the Date! Reminding everyone to replace smoke alarms every 10 years.
