 - Necessary for competitive edge
- Competition, i.e., Plano, Allen, Richardson, Dallas and Carrollton, substantial investments in course improvements
- City Supplements
 - Ex. City of Allen charged reduced green fees after substantial flooding damage from late spring weather

Future Opportunities

- Men's Golf Association, "MGA", over 60 members
 - Monthly tournaments
- Women's Golf Association, "WGA", over 45 members
 - Diamonds in the Rough tourney, 120 participants
 - Reciprocal play in Metroplex with other WGA Groups
- Teaching/Growth of Game

2016 Challenges/Areas of Concern

- Irrigation System
 - Antiquated system presents repair and maintenance challenges
 - Less than optimum course conditions
 - Competitive disadvantage
- Lifespan of Greens
 - Industry experts cite average lifespan of 20 years
 - Current age of 20 years
 - Grass will thin and become weak over time
- State of Golf
 - National averages show reduction in participation
 - Record spring rainfall, slight reduction in play
