CITY OF MCKINNEY – ARTS COMMISSION 2016/2017 GRANT YEAR FINAL GRANT REPORT – SUMMARY FINAL NARRATIVE

The McKinney Community Band (MCB) is now in its 11th season and we continue our mission to provide musical performances that are not only musically sound, but also engaging and fun. Our concerts expose audiences to a wide variety of music, helping enhance their appreciation and knowledge of music. Further, MCB provides an outlet for individuals to pursue their love of music, improve their skills, and perform.

Performances for this past grant year included the free, public concerts at the McKinney Performing Arts Center (MPAC):

- "Mystique" Concert, October 1, 2016 (325 attendance)
- "Red, White, and The Blues" Veteran's Day Concert, November 11, 2016 (325 attendance)
- "Countdown to Christmas" Concert, December 11, 2016 (325 attendance)
- "World of Music" Concert, March 26, 2017 (325 attendance)
- "America!" Concert, July 2, 2017 (340 attendance)

Other public performances were:

- Memorial Day Ceremony, Pecan Grove Cemetery, May 29, 2017 (1200 attendance)
- Jammin' in June, Bonnie Wenk Park, June 29, 2017 (240 attendance)

Through these free, public McKinney performances, we reached almost 3,100 people with music.

The band also performed at various private venues, such as Country Lane Retirement Center for Armed Forces Day and Highland Springs Retirement Center for its Holiday Tree Lighting event and again in the summer. These private events provide some revenue for the band, extend our outreach, and bring music to people unable physically to attend our concerts. MCB strongly believes that such performances provide a much needed service to those in the community that could not otherwise experience the joy of music.

Our satellite groups (the Dance Band and the Flute Choir) play public and private events as well. Not only do these private events provide revenue to be shared by the entire band program, but some events are for charitable organizations aimed at helping those in need. For example, the dance band performed at Challenge Air at the Frontiers of Flight Museum, a fundraiser to help terminally ill children fulfill their wish of flying small aircraft. Additionally, the flute choir performed at a Lifepath fundraiser for teen suicide prevention. Additional outreach and performances by these two groups are through venues such as retirement centers, churches, schools, and several social clubs.

For the second year in a row, the McKinney Dance Band and Flute Choir performed a joint, free, public concert at MPAC (attended by over 300 people) as a tribute to our veterans, entitled "Red, White, and The Blues" in November of 2016. Since the concert has been so well-received these past two years, we plan on continuing the event this year, scheduled for November at MPAC and titled "Red, White, and Basie". Another as yet un-themed concert has just been confirmed by MPAC for early May 2018.

If you count both public and private events, our organization has brought music to approximately 4,900 people this just concluded grant cycle year.

As a measure of other successes over the years, the MCB has:

- Developed a strong, core audience 79% of survey respondents have been to multiple band events;
- Acquired \$36,000 of instruments, sheet music, and equipment, enhancing overall quality and sound of band;
- Increased the amount of money that the band has generated by means other than our grant by over 30% each year on average since 2009;
- Increased individual donations by 32% from 2015 to 2016; and
- Supported city and community events such as Jammin' in June and Memorial Day Ceremony.

While our basic mission is providing quality musical performances and supporting/enhancing the arts community in McKinney, we feel our MPAC performances also help the downtown businesses by bringing people from all over North Texas to our downtown. In fact, the band surveys conducted at our MPAC concerts showed 50% of respondents lived in cities other than McKinney and 74% of respondents visited a McKinney restaurant, shop, or business before or after our concerts.
