Final Report Narrative for McKinney Repertory Theatre 2016-2017 Season

McKinney Repertory Theatre recently completed it 14th season. We opened our season with *The Hallelujah Girls*, a comedy by Jones, Hope, Wooten with six performances on October 7, 8, 9, 14, 15. Total attendance was 273.

In November and December we performed our annual production of *A Christmas Carol*, an adaption by McKinney resident Dr. Andrew Harris. An annual Holiday favorite, total attendance for the eight performances was 1291. Performances were November 25, 26, 27, during McKinney's Home For The Holidays, and December 16, 17. For the third year, we also did a staged reading at the Collin County Juvenile Detention Center. This year had six of the juveniles participate in the reading.

Neil Simon's *The Sunshine Boys*, a comedy about the strained relationship of two former vaudevillians who reunite after 11 years for a CBS special on the Kings of Comedy. Things don't turn out so well, with Willie Clark suffering a heart attack after an argument with his former partner during a rehearsal. In the end they reconcile, reminiscing about the 32 years they worked together. Attendance was 231, with six performances on March 10, 11, 12, 17, 18.

Our next production was *Don't Dress For Dinner* by Mark Camoletti. Bernard is planning a romantic weekend with his chic Parisian mistress in his charming converted French farmhouse, whilst his wife, Jacqueline, is away. He has arranged for a cordon bleu cook to prepare gourmet delights, and has invited his best friend, Robert, along too to provide the alibi. It's foolproof; what could possibly go wrong? Well.... suppose Robert turns up not realizing quite why he has been invited. Suppose Robert and Jacqueline are secret lovers, and consequently determined that Jacqueline will NOT leave for the weekend. Suppose the cook has to pretend to be the mistress and the mistress is unable to cook. Suppose everyone's alibi gets confused with everyone else's. An evening of hilarious confusion ensues as Bernard and Robert improvise at breakneck speed. Attendance was 291 for the six performances on May 12, 13, 14, 19, 20.

Our fifth production of the season was our annual melodrama, a popcorn throwing, audience participating show. This year's production was *Caught In The Villain's Web (or More Sinned Against Than Sinning)* by Herbert Swayne. Felicity Fair, down trodden heroine, is a nurse sent to the Larkfield mansion to attend a hard hearted society matron who is pretending to be ill to force her son, Malvern, to marry the scheming Nella Hargrave. Malvern takes one look at Felicity and falls in love. When Malvern proposes he is unaware that villain Cyril Bothingwell is behind a screen listening. Felicity sadly informs Malvern that she can never marry. Five years ago she was in a train wreck and cannot remember a thing that happened prior to the wreck. She doesn't even know her real name. Cyril tells Felicity that she is his wife but Cryil's nefarious schemes are thwarted to the delight of all. This year we added a third weekend for our melodrama, with nine performances on July 28, 29, 30, August 4, 5, 6, 11, 12. Total attendance was 414.

Not a part of our regular season, McKinney Rep also performed a Murder Mystery Dinner Theatre on September 30, 2016 at Chestnut Square, attended by 91. Income from the ticket sales is included in revenue, attendance is not.
