




Bike-Sharing Is Taking Off Around the World


Number of cities worldwide that offer bike-sharing systems (as of December 31, 2014)



















Number of Bike Share Systems in the US by Type






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



















































Deployment Type	Advantages	Disadvantages		
Point-to-Point	Convenience of picking up and leaving bikes at any available station Ideal for one-way trips Short-term free rentals	More expensive to deploy Bikes need to be periodically re-balanced across stations Discourages people from using the bicycles for recreational riding		
Ride-and-Return	 No operational time or resources are needed to rebalance the bikes less expensive to deploy than Point-to-Point won't get stranded without a ride 	Only practical for smaller scale systems, or location-based systems Provides less flexibility to riders		
Distributed	 Enables riders to stop and lock the bike as close as possible to their final destination riders can find available bikes nearby on a map on their phone 	Bikes aren't always in predictable locations Riders unwilling to search for bikes




