Alterations to the residence.

According to the Sanborn map of 1920, the residence originally had a front porch going the full width of the home and a porch on the northwest corner of the home. I do not have information about when the front porch was partially enclosed to create a sun room which then also created an east entrance to the home. This alteration is still part of the residence. An addition to the east entrance was also made which provided a screened in porch next to the driveway. The roof on this porch was not done to the correct pitch of a roof and was leaking. This screened in porch was removed in 2016, as part of adding new gutters to the east side of the house to allow for adequate drainage away from the home. The area shown as a back porch in the Sanborn map of 1920 had been enclosed before we purchased the home and the back door provided an exit to a large elevated deck. The deck was in poor condition and was removed in 2011, for safety reasons where a patio was created at ground level. Access to this patio was made possible by creating a landing with stairs to the ground level of the yard. In the process of removing the deck we discovered a well which had probably been used prior to the modernization of indoor plumbing to the home. The water table has dropped and the well is no longer viable. As a safety precaution, the well has a steel plate with two padlocks and a custom designed outdoor table covering any possible access to the well. No other exterior alterations have been made to the home. All of the alterations have been done with the intent of keeping the home as close as possible to the original building as represented in pictures and documents related to the home.
