Pulitzer Finalist Lee Martin & UNT Lecturer Carla Carter-Bishop Denton's Quakertown: A Black History Month Conversation



In observation of Black History Month, 2018, the Friends of the McKinney Public Library presented *Denton's Quakertown: A Black History Month Conversation with Pulitzer Finalist Lee Martin and UNT Lecturer Carla Lyndale Carter-Bishop.* The program was funded by a grant from the McKinney Arts Commission and featured a reading and discussion from Martin's novel, *Quakertown*, as well as an historical video presentation by Carter-Bishop, bookended by musical selections by the New Jerusalem Baptist Church Choir.


The primary event took place at 7 PM, Thursday, February 8, at the McKinney Performing Arts Center in downtown McKinney. Co-sponsored by the McKinney Library System, City of McKinney, McKinney Arts Commission, MPAC, the Collin County Alumnae of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, the North Texas Suburbia Alumnae of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc., and the Collin County Unit of the NAACP, and Half Price Books, tickets for the event were free to the public. 


Posters and fliers were distributed throughout McKinney, and invitations were mailed to library patrons.





At noon on February 8, Author Lee Martin presented a reading and discussion from his book Quakertown, to an audience of approximately 150 students, educators, and citizens at Collin County Community College, McKinney Campus.







In presenting Martin's book *Quakertown*, we partnered with CCCC's African American History Committee, chaired by Professor Cathy Donald-Whitney, and Open Minds/Open Doors, chaired by Professor Catie Brooks. Open Minds/Open Doors organizes events to increase dialogue about issues such as religion, racism and gender discrimination.

Friday morning, February 9, 2018, Dr. Martin visited the AVID class at McKinney Boyd High School, led by teacher Alice Ellenburg. AVID stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination, and is a college readiness program that targets students with the potential of attending college who are not enrolled in advanced classes.

Dr. Martin, Distinguished Professor of English at The Ohio State University as well as renowned author, talked to the students about writing, and about how to meet the challenges ahead of them.





Over the course of two periods, Dr. Martin talked to about 50 students. He was so impressed with the program, and the students of McKinney Boyd High School, that he wrote about them in his blog, in an article entitled "Teachers Making a Difference."
