

Built in 1911, this Texas Historic Landmark served as a post office until 1959. The building now serves as a museum with exhibits, photographs and artifacts that showcase the rich historical heritage of Collin County. The building is located one block east of the historic downtown square. Museum hours are Thursday-Saturday, 10 am-4pm. Special tours and events can be arranged on Monday through Wednesday by contacting the museum.

The Heard-Craig Center for the Arts is one of the earliest art museums in McKinney. Gifted in 1970 by Katheryn Heard-Craig, this 1900 home is on the National Register of Historic Homes. The center has outstanding collections of artwork and boasts a wonderful collection of early Texas regional art by Thomas Stell, Frank Klepper and Allie Tennant. The center also has a beautiful garden and Carriage House, holds regular events and exhibits open to the public, is available for tours daily from 8:00am-4:00pm and can be booked for private events year-round.

Chestnut Square is a collection of six historic homes, a replica of a one-room schoolhouse, chapel and store on 2.5 acres just south of the downtown McKinney square. The grounds also include a seasonal farmer's market, blacksmith shop, smoke house, and a reception house and reception gardens. The events at the village are focused on celebrating Collin County's heritage. The Visitors Center is open Tuesday-Friday, 9am-3pm, and Saturdays during Farmers Market. Tours can be arranged by contacting the village office.



Upon approval of the grant funding the project can be completed in 3-4 days.


- 1. Removal of the current shades
- 2. The surface of the current windows would be cleaned and prepared for the application of the UV and solar tinting. A 2mil Dual Reflective coating will be applied to each pane within each window.

Project Timeline

- 3. The windows in the main gallery will be completed first and completed on the days the museum is closed.
- 4. The media room will be completed next and completed on the days the museum is closed.
- 5. The windows on the side foyer will be completed last.

Project Timeline

This tinting will block 99% of the harmful UV rays.




This tinting will block 64% of the light rays and 56% of the heat rays from entering through the windows, thus protecting the museum assets from damage and deterioration.



- 1. The new window tinting will allow for easy dusting and cleaning of the windows, eliminating the buildup of dust allergens.
- The tinting will also provide an added benefit by blocking heat rays and providing an increase in HVAC efficiency with an increase in energy savings.

The coating still allows a clear view from the inside, while providing protection for the damaging effects of the sun.
