Final Report for McKinney Rotary Clubs' All-Abilities Playground

- **Narrative:**

In January 2015, the Sunrise Rotary Club discussed and approved approaching the City of McKinney to help in raising funds for an “inclusive” or “All-Abilities” playground in McKinney. The vision was to provide a playground in McKinney with total access for those with special needs whether they be physical or cognitive in nature. Larry Offerdahl and Juli Smith volunteered to co-chair the project and proceeded with a “needs assessment”. The results, after discussions with Dr. Paul Foster, Director of MISD Special Populations, was the 2015 enrollment included just over 10% of the student population utilizing Special Population programs. This was approximately 2,700 students which did not include McKinney children who attended schools in adjacent districts, private schools, were home schooled or pre-school age. The City of McKinney was addressing their needs for outdoor recreation by following the ADA mandated law of having approximately 20% of play space accessible to children with special needs at each playground. The Rotary Clubs believed with all the recreational building in McKinney, there needed to be a venue/facility with accessibility for all children and adults regardless of mobility or cognitive issues.

In March 2015, the co-chairs met with Barry Shelton, Assistant City Manager and Rhoda Savage, Executive Director of Parks and Recreation, to present our proposal with Bonnie Wenk Park Phase II as a location. During the next few months, meetings were held with the Parks Department personnel and design consultants to outline probable costs, time, commitment, etc. for the Rotary. The Sunrise Rotary Club applied for and received IRS 501(C)3 status and accepted the responsibility of paying the City-Contracted Landscape Designer \$30,000 for the playground design. The other McKinney Rotary Club became part of the coalition which increased the number of Rotarians involved to over 100 members. A joint Board was established which met every two weeks in the first six months and then monthly. Both clubs were represented. A joint bank account was opened at Independent Bank with signatories from each club. A bookkeeper was hired who was a member of the McKinney Rotary Club and she and Board Treasurer (from the Sunrise Club) provided the accounting controls for all bank transactions. Financials reviewed each month by the entire board. A CPA was hired, and he has prepared all IRS documents since the coalition formed. We have been using the IRS' 501(c)3 from the McKinney Rotary Club (Downtown) because theirs has been inexistence for several years and the Sunrise club was set up three years ago. The members represented their individual clubs and In September 2015 a public/private proposal was presented to the McKinney City Council and a resolution was approved. In December the Rotary Clubs were given the “green light” to begin public fund raising and our first mailing was made to over 5,000 homes. Meetings continued with parents, businesses and other community members. A Facebook page began (Rotary All Abilities Playground) and currently has over 1,000 members. The Rotary set up a Website for the playground and opened a site for donations on “Crowdrise”. We have closed the page down recently as the donations weremuch less than the monthly charge to maintain the site. Donations are accepted through our Flag lease program and on line on our club website.

In 2016, it became evident that the All-Abilities Playground would be part of the timeline the City of McKinney was working with for the all of Bonnie Wenk Phase II. Because of this, there was no set time line for the All-

Abilities Playground, and the decision was made to raise funds by partnering with other non-profits to minimize expenses and shortened lead times for events. The 30 plus grants applied for would not be awarded, in some cases, until the following year. Due to the non-specific timeline/finish date, the Rotary Clubs of McKinney decided to apply for a grant of \$200,000 with a contingency of backstop funding from McKinney Community Development Corporation (MCDC). The city's "working" completion date, was less than a year away and the Rotary was receiving the funding at the rate to "match" this request. The grant awarded was \$200,000 and, in May 2017, MCDC awarded a second grant of up to \$75,000 for a total award of \$275,000.00. The Rotary Clubs of McKinney had reached the obligation of funding the first \$200,000.00.

The inability to provide timelines and preliminary architectural drawings of the playground early in the fundraising process were weaknesses in our grant proposals to the larger regional and national foundations. In two situations, we were told to reapply again during the next cycle 18 months later; which was too late in the process to do. At this point, the decision was made to increase our concentration on local and smaller businesses for support. This approach proved successful and we received donations/grants from Sprouts Healthy Communities Foundations, The Bob Tomes Family, Love Life Foundation, Step-up Reality, Wendy Pollard Foundation and several local banks, to name a few. Our efforts at the school level targeted the Parent/Teacher organizations. Throughout the first six months, the La Terra designer, the Parks and Recreation lead staff and our Rotary board members met monthly to discuss and bring everyone up to date on progress.

During 2016 and 2017, the Rotary co-chairs spoke at service clubs, churches and social clubs throughout McKinney and North Collin County, members contacted over 300 businesses and, using water bill inserts, over 50,000 homes were contacted. Additionally, parent groups, PTAs and PTOs were contacted. Fund raisers at local restaurants such as Local Yocal and Panera's Bakery donated daily proceeds and Nothing Bundt Cakes donated 30% of a day's proceeds as did other businesses. These smaller events generated awareness, and subsequently, presentation invitations. MCDC is our largest donor with the Rotary Clubs the second largest with over \$80,000 including member donations.

This project was driven by volunteers who spent hours of time and much of their own funds to maintain the energy over the three years raising funds for the All-Abilities Playground. Because of the length of time for this project, many of the efforts were spent reminding the community of the all-Abilities Playground and the need for it. The ALPHA students who participated in 3rd and 4th grade are now in middle school. This has been a community effort from the beginning and sustaining the momentum has been a challenge the Rotary Clubs have taken. We are proud of the partnerships forged in the process and thank everyone who has given of their time and funds.

- **Goals and Objectives Achieved**

The Rotary Clubs of McKinney's goal was to raise the funding for the All-Abilities Playground, through community and business donations, grants, business contributions and members' donations. Based on the information given to us by the Landscape designer contracted by the City of McKinney, La Terra, the initial goal/budget was \$560,000.00. The amount raised was \$533,697.95 which includes the designer fee of \$30,000 and other expenses required to proceed with this project. The MCDC grant was based on the contractor's bid amount of \$503,180.60 for the playground area and equipment only. The bid invoice was \$20,000 less than originally submitted (\$483,180.60) after a direct donation to the city. The Rotary continued to collect donations reducing the MCDC funding to **\$218,000.00** from the maximum award of \$275,000. **This represents MCDC's funding of 45% of the playground area bid and 41% of the total project.** The primary goal of the Rotary Clubs of McKinney was to raise the funds for the playground; and following the MCDC's award, to have MCDC's funding be less than 50% of the cost.

- **Financial Report**

Attached are the 3/31/2019 Balance Sheet and P & L. As mentioned above, the initial budget was \$560,000 and it was based on conversations with the landscape designer and Park Department information. This figure

represents the entire playground project. The budget MCDC reviewed was for the "bid" process and it was \$503,180.60. The "Income" variances are due to the initial budgets versus the bookkeeper's categorizing (i.e. businesses, corporate and grants). Another variance to be noted is the "fundraisers". As mentioned above, the number of individual fundraisers was reduced. An example is a "Fun Run" we had begun planning and ultimately, we partnered with Chestnut Square and their Ice Cream Crank Off/Fun Run. The proceeds from that event was given to the playground project in the form of a donation rather than as proceeds from a Fun Run. We only provided the volunteers for the Fun Run.

Under expenses, we did not budget the fees to establish our 501(c)3 and the legal fees required by Texas. The Accountant fees were less due part of the actual work done on a volunteer or reduced rate basis. The marketing expenses were posted for printing and stamps and they were included in the marketing budget originally. We underbudgeted this because of the "Donor Appreciation Evening" which was paid for by the Rotary clubs. We are leaving approximately \$600.00 in the Foundation's bank account for CPA expenses we anticipate at the end of our fiscal year on June 30, 2018.

- **Performance against Metrics outlined in application**

The Rotary Clubs of McKinney reached their fundraising goal (in theory if not in actuality). Our goal was to raise as much funding as possible with the assistance of grants. It would have been better had we been able to raise enough to not have to utilize any of the second grant MCDC awarded. The \$18,000 is 24% of the maximum MCDC awarded us in the second proposal. The total investment/support from MCDC is 41% of the total project. One goal we had internally was to spend as little as possible while raising these funds and we succeeded in keeping expenses under \$20,000. The most important metric will be the results of a community-wide survey. I have just had meeting with Adrienne Morris, MISD Director of Special Populations, and I believe the schools will be a contributing factor to accurate surveys. Social media, the internet, the media and the City of McKinney will all be asked to participate in the administration of a jointly written survey. We know this All-Abilities Playground will not address everyone's needs, nor will it please all residents. It is a place to begin the conversation as to what the needs are for children with special needs. The surveys will prioritize the "next steps" in the process.





The focus of a standard playground to allow children with special needs (Down's Syndrome, autism, muscular dystrophy, visual and hearing impairments and other challenges) to experience the "Gift of Play" alongside other children. Children and adults in wheelchairs, walkers and braces will be provided with equipment and design address the needs of children with development delays, special sensory requirements and other physical challenges. There are benches near all the play areas for parental supervision, wheelchair ramps to equipment and picnic tables for birthday parties and playdates. Children with special needs can play side by side with their siblings and other children.

The Rotary Clubs in McKinney have joined together to make this vision a reality by entering a partnership with the City of McKinney. The city will enhance the infrastructure around the playground, including a restroom adjacent to the playground, ramps and additional parking for vans and buses. The McKinney Rotary Clubs have committed to raise sponsorships to pay for the additional costs of an All-Abilities playground's specialized equipment and foundation. The timeline for the playground's "grand opening" is fall 2017. We don't have long to raise the remaining funds required. We have raised or pledged over \$400,000 already.




