ORDINANCE NO. 2007-01-004

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1332, OF THE CITY OF MCKINNEY, TEXAS; SO THAT AN APPROXIMATELY 8.94 ACRE PROPERTY, GENERALLY LOCATED ON THE TENNESSEE STREET AND CORNER OF **NORTHEAST** WALKER STREET, IS REZONED FROM "PD" - PLANNED "PD" **PLANNED** TO **DISTRICT DEVELOPMENT** DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT, GENERALLY TO ALLOW OFFICE AND MEDICAL OFFICE USES AND DECREASE THE DENSITY **PROVIDING DEVELOPMENT**; **MULTI-FAMILY** REGULATIONS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR INJUNCTIVE RELIEF, PROVIDING FOR NO VESTED INTEREST; PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THE CAPTION OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

WHEREAS,

the City of McKinney has considered the rezoning of an approximately 8.94 acre property, generally located on the northeast corner of Tennessee Street and Walker Street, from "PD" – Planned Development District to "PD" – Planned Development District, generally to allow office and medical office uses and decrease the density of multi-family development, and,

WHEREAS.

after due notice of the requested rezoning as required by law, and the required public hearings held before the Planning and Zoning Commission and the City Council of the City of McKinney, Texas, the City Council is of the opinion that the change in zoning district should be made.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF McKINNEY, TEXAS:

Section 1.

Ordinance No. 1332 is hereby amended so that an approximately 8.94 acre property, generally located on the northeast corner of Tennessee Street and Walker Street, which is more fully depicted on Exhibit "A", attached hereto, is hereby rezoned from "PD" — Planned Development District to "PD" — Planned Development District, generally to allow office and medical office uses and decrease the density of multi-family development.

Section 2.

Use and development of the subject property shall conform to the following regulations:

- The subject property shall develop generally in accordance with the attached Zoning <u>Exhibit</u> (Exhibit "B").
- The subject property shall conform to "PD" Planned Development District Ordinance No. 1332, except as follows:
 - a. General office and medical office be permitted as allowed uses.
 - The maximum allowed density of multi-family development on the subject property shall not exceed 20 dwellings units per acre.

Section 3.

If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, phrase or clause of this Ordinance shall be declared invalid for any reason whatsoever, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

Section 4.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to develop this property, or any portion thereof, in any manner other than is authorized by this Ordinance, and upon conviction therefore, shall be fined any sum not exceeding \$2,000.00, and each day that such violation shall continue shall be considered a separate offense. These penal provisions shall not prevent an action on behalf of the City of McKinney to enjoin any violation or threatened violation of the terms of this Ordinance, or an action for mandatory injunction to remove any previous violation hereof.

Section 5.

That no developer or property owner shall acquire any vested interest in this Ordinance or specific regulations contained herein. The ordinance, and the subsequent site plans (if any) and regulations may be amended or repealed by the City Council of the City of McKinney, Texas, in the manner provided by law.

Section 6.

The caption of this Ordinance shall be published one time in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of McKinney, and shall become effective upon such publication.




