This allows children not only to engage in the show, but then ask questions about the process of the creating a play, being an artist and theater itself. We want to engage children in thinking about the arts as a vehicle for creative expression and as a viable profession. The play is designed for elementary age youth, 6-12, and is created by Omar Padilla, who has been trained to work as an arts-in-education performer with youth of this age range. This presentation will be made available free and will be presented where a large group of students will be able to access the show. Additionally, the play is in English, with some Spanish phrases included, to create a linguistic bridge with Hispanic students who frequently do not have access to professional theater, either because of economic barriers, language or transportation.
