


Why Community Healthcare?

- To provide the <u>right</u> care at the <u>right</u> time because it's the <u>right</u> thing to do.

- To keep fire apparatus and mobile intensive care units in service.
- Reduce unnecessary Code 3 response, thereby reducing risk to the traveling public and first responders.
- · Reduce need for user groups to access emergency services.
- Address the uncertainty of EMS reimbursement into the future.
- Address the uncertainty of EMS activity in a changing demographic.


















MFD Community Healthcare Program Highlights

- MFD program launch June 3, 2013, with two medics.
- Began proactive visitation June 19, 2013 to at-risk cohort high utilizer groups.
- June 21, 2013, enrolled first patient into program.
- July 9, 2013, initiated pilot Advanced Practice Paramedic program with Collin College.
- Added congestive heart failure cohort in 2014.







MFD Community Healthcare Program Highlights

- 319 patients since the inception of the program (does not include family members who receive services due to proximity).
- 48 patients currently enrolled and receive frequent visitation. 150 (+) requiring phone supervision or infrequent visitation.
- FY18 total of 1215 home visits
- FY18 total of 66 hospital visits
- FY18 total of 136- 911 avoidances
- 99 (+) avoidance average approximately 11.33 per month for FY19 to date.





MFD Community Healthcare Program Highlights

- Over 45 (+) fire based EMS agencies across the nation and Hong Kong requested information on the McKinney Fire Department CHP program.
- MFD interned representatives from approximately 10 other agencies.

MFD Community Healthcare Program – Future

Goals:

- Place second CHP squad in service 1 day per week using one App and either nurse practitioner or additional firefighter/paramedic by end of April, 2019.
- Expand scope of squad on response to high acuity calls for service.
- Explore additional partnerships to expand service delivery while minimizing cost.
- Purpose to assist first squad with current patient care plans...to increase
 patient population as participation increases from both major hospitals in the
 area...to provide mass public education on "stop the bleed" and "hands only
 CPR."
