PROPOSED CODE MODIFICATION

- PROS Board – November 2018
- City Council Work Session – December 2018
- Approve an Ordinance Establishing Specific Guidelines for the Sale, Service and Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages in and about Certain Specified City-Owned Parklands and Recreation Centers.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Builds upon current rules and regulations in place for special events and MPAC
- Allows for only beer and wine – no liquor
- No City employee can sell or serve alcohol
- Does not allow for casual, open consumption in our parks or facilities outside of an approved event, program, or management or vendor contract

RECREATION FACILITIES

- All recreation facilities
 - Community Center
 - Senior Recreation Center
 - Old Settler's Recreation Center
 - Apex Centre
 - Courts of McKinney Tennis Center
 - Parks Administration Offices

- Each instance/location will have specific conditions:
 - Fees, approved areas, off duty police officers



PARKLAND

- Specific areas
 - Oak Hollow Golf Course (140 acres)
 - Towne Lake Recreation Area (230 acres)
 - Gabe Nesbitt Community Park (160 acres)
 - Bonnie Wenk Community Park (168 acres)
 - Craig Ranch Soccer Complex (65 acres)
 - McKinney Soccer Complex at Craig Ranch (65 acres)
 - Al Ruschhaupt Soccer Complex 1 & 2 (114 acres)
 - Old Settler's Park (29 acres)
 - Finch Park (32 acres)
 - Mitchell Park (1 acre)

- Each instance/location will have to follow existing special event rules and regulations
