

CITY OF MCKINNEY ARTS COMMISSION 2017/2018 GRANT YEAR FINAL GRANT REPORT – SUMMARY FINAL NARRATIVE

The McKinney Community Band (MCB) is now in its 13th season and we continue our mission to provide performances that are not only musically sound, but also engaging and fun. Our concerts expose audiences to a wide variety of music, helping enhance their appreciation and knowledge of music. Further, MCB provides an outlet for individuals to pursue their love of music, improve their skills, and perform.

Performances for this past grant year included the free, public concerts at the McKinney Performing Arts Center (MPAC):

- "Thrills at the Theater" Concert, October 14, 2018
- "Red, White, and Big Band" Veteran's Day Concert, November 9, 2018
- "Ringing in Christmas" Concert, December 2, 2018
- "Band Bonanza" Concert, April 7, 2019
- "Big Band Royalty: Count Meets Duke" Concert, May 3, 2019
- "American Anthem" Concert, June 30, 2019

Through these free, public McKinney performances, we reached approximately 2,000 people with music.

The band and its satellite groups (the McKinney Dance Band and the McKinney Flute Choir) play public and private events as well. These performances extend our outreach, expose new people to our organization, and provide additional revenue for the band. The concert band performed twice at Highland Springs Retirement Center and also joined forces with the Plano Community Band at the Eisemann Performing Arts Center. The Dance Band and Flute Choir often play at venues too small for the concert band such as retirement centers, McKinney Senior Center, churches, and schools. Additionally, the Dance Band played at the Spectacular Senior Follies at the Eisemann, which generated more interest in that group and increased revenue. If you add these private events, we reached over 6,500 people with music.

This year, our band began an outreach program to work with middle school and high school band students. MCB invited students to rehearse with our band as we played band UIL literature. This gave the students additional practice time on competition music and also exposed them to additional music and techniques. We hope to continue developing our relationships with schools over the next few years.

MCB's leadership has worked hard over the past 13 years to build a premier community band organization. We are known for our high quality, engaging, and fun concerts. During our October concert, we had an instrument petting zoo, where children (and adults) could try out various instruments. Additionally, the audience (and conductor) dressed in costume. In December, Santa surprised our audience with a visit, led the crowd in a holiday sing along, and took pictures with children after the concert.

Our organization has been a good steward of both the grant money awarded to us by the Arts Commission and of the money we have raised on our own. We now have over \$50,000 of instruments, music, and equipment, enabling our ensembles to not only sound good, but to develop and continue their reputations of top-notch, excellent musical groups.

I would like to conclude our narrative with an excerpt from a letter received after our fall concert: "Dear McKinney Band, Thanks for the great melodious concert- my fave was Wagner! The concert was entertaining for all ages and tastes."
