We have begun planning our Spring Break 2020 programming schedule and have decided to do a '7 Days in 7 Continents' theme and would love the opportunity to host Teatro Dallas during that week. Project Grant Proposal 2019-2020 City of McKinney

Teatro Dallas has created a new play that addresses ecology and conservation in an innovative and interactive way for audiences of all ages. We are requesting \$4,500 to bring three free presentations of *Tlali: When We Were Earth* to families and youth in McKinney. The production is in English, with some Spanish and a few Mayan words, and it is designed to both instill a sense of stewardship and connection to the earth, while also introducing children to elements of the ancient cultures of Latin America. This production is suitable for all ages, but it is formatted to share Latin American culture with the residents of McKinney, and we have found that seeing one's stories on stage brings a sense of pride and acceptance for communities that are often marginalized, such as Latinos.

Imagine if our earth could talk? What would she tell us? Using puppetry, instruments and imaginative costumes made from recycled materials, join a young boy on an interactive journey into ancient roots that reveal how we can care for our greatest treasure, Tlali, the earth. For all ages, this bilingual production celebrates Latin American mythology and its cultural connection to sustainability and ecology.

Teatro Dallas has a 35-year history of creating workshops, classes, plays and programs for children that promote creativity and stimulate the senses and using theater as an educational tool. We have partnerships with recreation centers, libraries and schools throughout the North Texas area, the Trinity River Audubon Center, Big Thought and other service agencies that work with youth. Our actors are vetted through both the City of Dallas Office of Cultural Affairs and DISD, and we help encourage youth to find strength and self- esteem through the power of performance. This production was created with support from the Texas Commission on the Arts and with research support from the University of North Texas.

Each production last 40 minutes with 10 minutes of "talk-back" with the children and their families after the show to discuss the play and answer questions. The talk backs are a great way to reflect on the connection between the past and our present climate, as well as validate the curiosity of the audience. This production would support the goals of the City of McKinney as it strives to ensure opportunities to engage with the arts for all of its citizens, regardless of age, economic, transportation or language barriers. It also supports the goal of providing educational connection vis-a vis the arts. The cost of \$1500 per production covers artistic fees for two actors, a stage

manager and technician and a live musician (5 artists total), as well as transportation costs for actors, sets, costumes, props and sound equipment, and insurance.

Teatro Dallas has already established ties with some of the following locations in McKinney: the McKinney Public Library, Caldwell Elementary, and The Boys and Girls Club of Collin County. The McKinney Public Library has already reached out to us with an interest in scheduling the production for well over 150 children and their families during Spring Break 2020. These positive relationships we have established with our programs in past years, afford us the ability to present this production across the city. Teatro Dallas proposes presenting the play at one location in February, and two in March. Marketing pieces will be created and can be tailored to each location. This timeline allows for Teatro Dallas to successfully partner with the three hosting sites in order to reach a large audience/attendance.
