The Community Grants Advisory Commission of the City of McKinney, Texas met in regular session in the 2nd Floor Conference Room, City Hall, 222 N. Tennessee Street, McKinney, Texas on May 30, 2019 at 6:30 p.m.

Administrator Best stated that Community Support Grants are funded by the City of McKinney, must be at least \$3,000; the proposed budget is \$179,700, contingent upon City Council approval in August. CDBG grants are reimbursable grants, are federally funded by HUD, and must be at least \$5,000. The 30-day public comment period has been changed to July 5 August 5. The City Council public hearing for CDBG will be on August 5th and the public hearing for CSG will be on October 15. She reminded commissioners that agencies were not penalized for

lack of participation at the presentations. Agencies who applied for audit waivers are not eligible for CDBG funding. Commissioners unanimously approved the motion by Commissioner Loughmiller, seconded by Commissioner Franklin, to approve grant funding recommendations to City Council as follows:
