*This design is based on a wing that is 34.5" tall and 25.2" wide

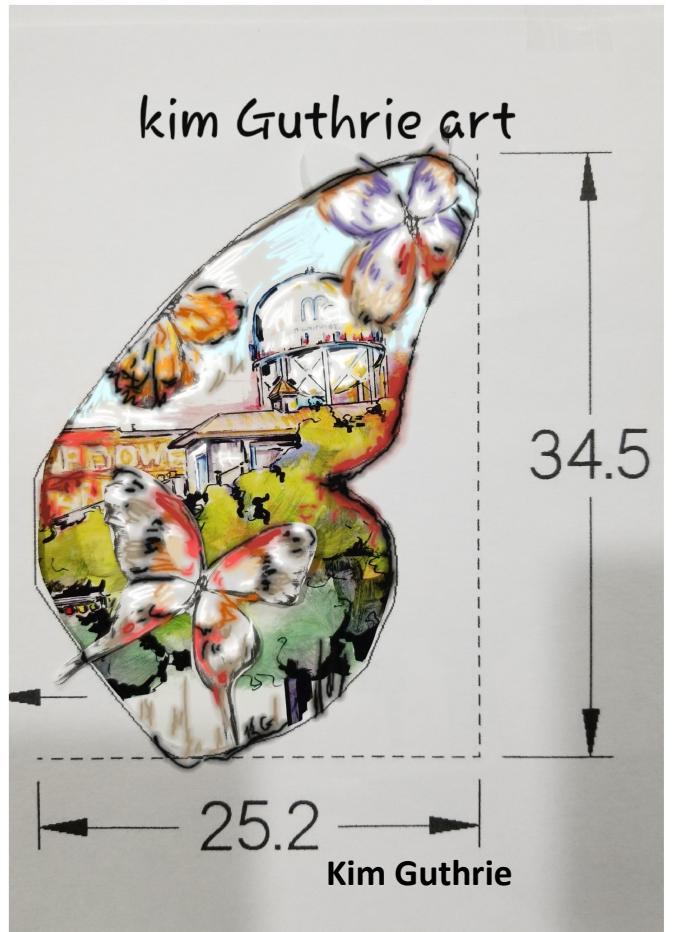
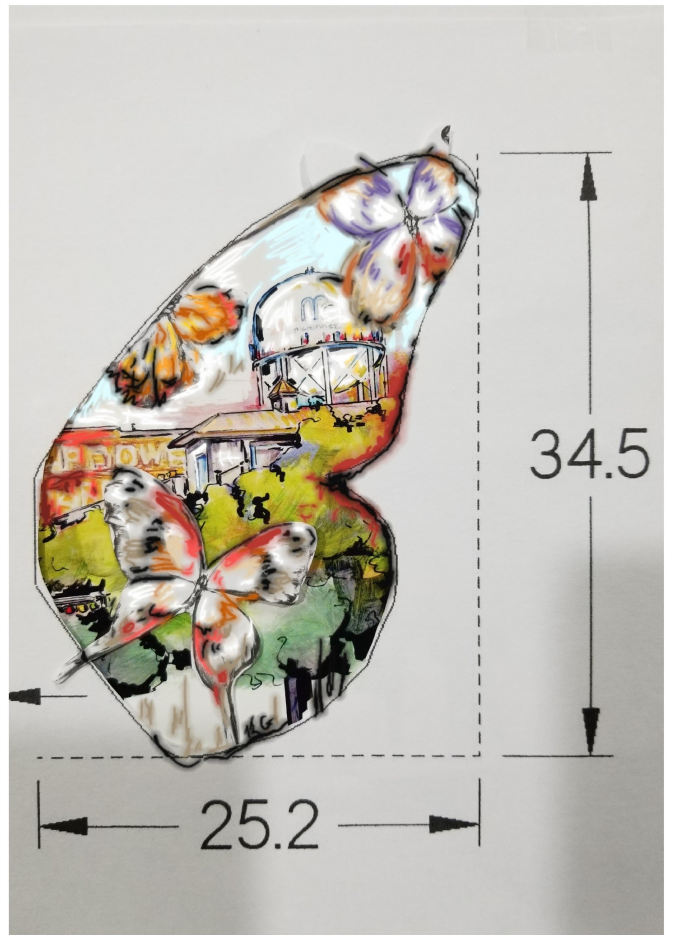

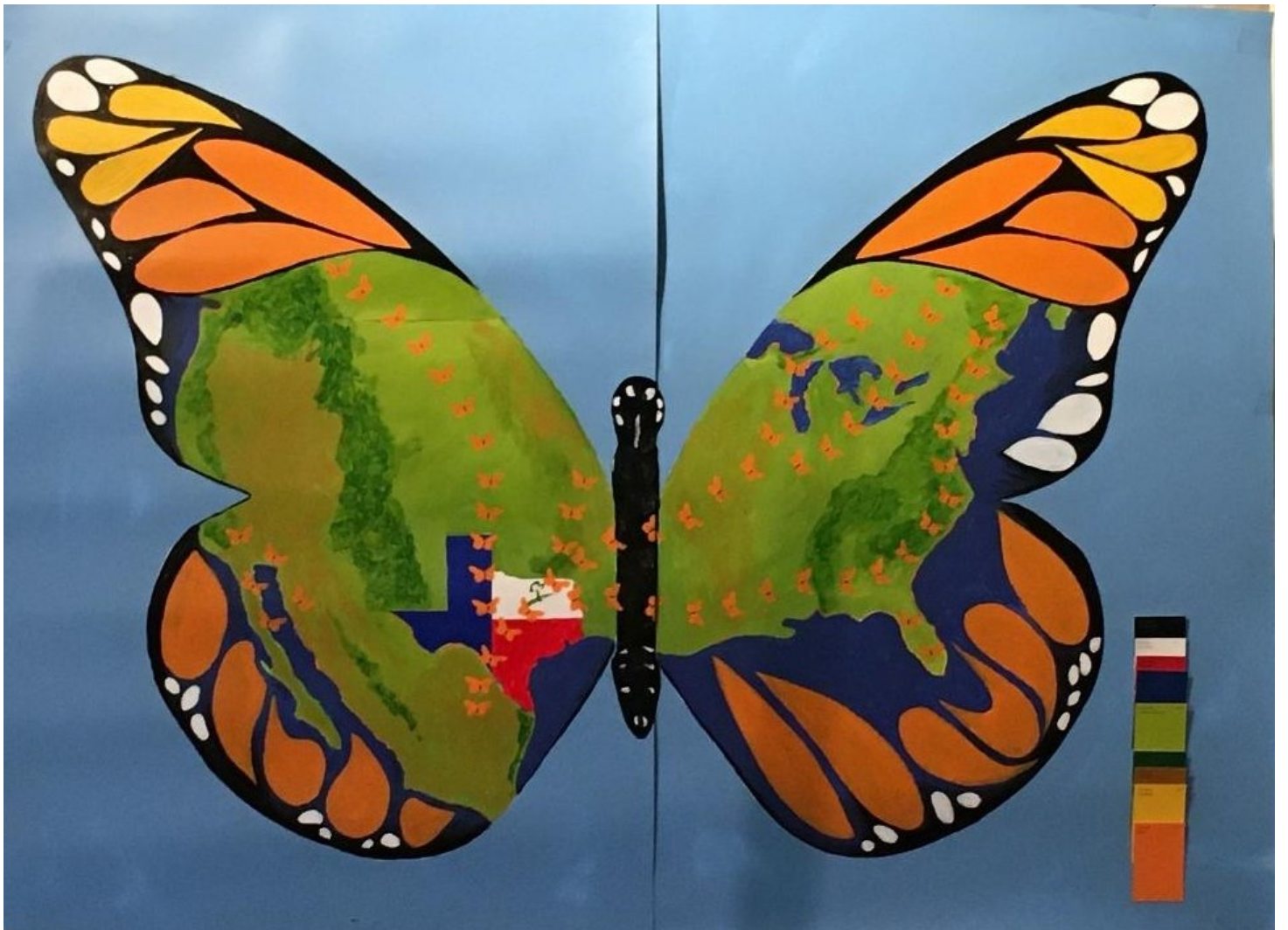
*This image is based on a metal butterfly with a 4' wing-span and will sit on top of an 8' high metal pole.
