Collin County History Museum Summary for Promotional Grant by: Mary Carole Strother, Executive Director January 15, 2020

January 2019, the Collin County History Museum was awarded a promotional grant for \$11,675 for advertising and promotional expenses for our *McKinney Then and Now* Exhibit.

The McKinney Then and Now Exhibit opened to the public on

Thursday, February 28, 2019. During the 10 months of 2019, over 7,000 people visited the exhibit. That was around the same number that attended our WWI exhibit in 2018 over a 12-month period of time. So, we saw an increase in attendance of 20% for our 2019 McKinney Then and Now Exhibit.

We had visitors from Japan, Korea, Canada, Brazil, Mexico, Russia, Puerto Rico, Australia, Sweden, Colombia, and England. We also had visitors from 36 different states, with a large majority of our out-of-state visitors from California. We had visitors from all across the state of Texas and Collin County.

Approximately 75% of the visitors were first-time visitors to the museum.

In 2019, we saw an increase in the number of vans and tour bus groups that brought groups to the exhibit. We averaged 5 tour groups a month throughout 2019.

ur building was built between 1911-1913, as a federal building, in the Italianate style then popular for government buildings during the Beaux Arts movement.

It continues to boast many original features, such as a triple arch entryway leading to a lobby filled with many period details, a cast iron and marble staircase, original light fixtures and doors, and a terrazzo and marble floor.

he Federal Building served the City of McKinney and the surrounding area as a post office, postal savings bank and government office for 46 years.



Due to city growth, the building was scheduled to be replaced in 1941, but was postponed because of WWII, and did not close as a post office until 1959. However, the land had been deeded to Collin

County in 1940, and from 1959 until 1964, the county used the building as the headquarters for Civil Defense, and the Texas Department of Public safety leased it as a drivers license office. By 1970, the building was being used as a warehouse by the county fire marshal.

The building, badly in need of repair, was abandoned for several years. Rescue began in 1976, when former first lady, Lady Bird Johnson cut the ribbon dedicating it as a museum. Restoration took six years before the building reopened as the Central Museum in the Old Post Office.

Oday it is known as our Collin County History Museum.









The Collin County History Museum is a 501 (c) (3) and receives support through state and local grants.






Through a promotional grant provided by the McKinney Community Development Corporation the museum has been able to provide marketing materials



Treasuring our Past

dking floogh the doors of the Collin County History Museum, in historic downtown McKinney, you got a glierque of the early days of McKieney. Over one hundred years age, the Federal Building at the corner of Virginia and Chestrat Street was

a bucking center of communication and summerse and served as the McKisney Past Office. In 1907, Congressmen Choice B. Rasdell called for a permanent Past Office to be built in McKinney applacing the routed spaces that but been used since McKresoy was established to 1946: Congress approprised \$100,000 to the construction of a new building in 1906. The following year, Mrs. South M. Bengo sold a city for that was 120x130 foot in size to the United States Government for

On April 21, 1911 construction of the building was exerted to John Barden

of Forth Worth for the contract price of 544,949. Two assets later, excuration work began and in July the loying of the concrete foundation for the building started and the first brick was laid. In August, work on the grants Sepalation began and on Septendar 20, 1911 the helding construes was set in place with a special contracty. The literature for the exterior of the building came from Codar Pork Quarry in Williamson County, Tours. The material for the grey granks base and front steps came from the Linne Fields Quarty. The inner walls ware hollow carnest tile, a new product designed for furgreed construction.

Construction on the building was delayed by five months due to winter rains and shipment delays caused by a rail strike. Work resumed once again on the building, and in May 1912 a findox buildr was installed its the basomers. The boiler, built by the Koverner Berler Corporation, was fiscled by burning coal and supplied the building with both host and her water. This raethed of heating was used until the building was updated to one natural year

In Outober of 1912, construction of the building was nearing completion. as an 6-fast sensiving door and 302 bross read busins were installed in the entrance. In December, the building was impacted and accepted by the government and the staff began moving into their new location.

On January 2, 1915, the McKlessey Federal Building was opened to the public. The total cost to build and famish it was \$95,000. There were 17 post office employees including 2 city mail ours, 6-rural delivery man, 5 specialized clerics and two building junitors. The postal rate was 2 cents and post cards were 1 cent. The McKinney Post Office did £30,166.90 worth of business.

The Post Office had many distinctive architectural features including a terrazzo and exactile floor in the entryway of the lobby. At the eastern end of the lobby was a teller window for the Postal Savings Bank. The bank had a vault which held the dolly deposits which were then torreferred at the end of each working day to one of the banks on the

Arched windows led into the main room used for processing the stail. The mail ment had hardwood floors and a safe where the employee payor'll and postal money urdens were kept. The Protentater's office was on the wost side of the processing room. His assisteer's office was just off the lobby floor. There was a restourn between the uffices with a viewing room overlooking the main unting swee. A anathle staintase with oraste iron calling led up to the third floor. This area was used as office space for visits from the Postal Inspector and other government. werkers.



building is the home of the Collin County History Messum and many. of the historic features of the building have been preserved making this building a valuable treasure of our past.



The McKinney Then and Now exhibit allows visitors the opportunity to step back in time and experience what life was like in the early days of McKinney. Historic photos, artifacts, and set designs of historic buildings help tell the stories of the people, places, and events that helped shape McKinney.

Visitors to the exhibit use an iPad to scan QR codes that are linked to videos. Through these videos they will hear stories about early McKinney told through the historical vignettes of Collin County historians. They can also experience a modern day look at McKinney through 3-D images and drone videography.

An exciting new feature of the exhibit is the use of augmented reality. The iPad has an app called HP Reveal that makes this feature possible. After launching the app, you simply point the camera of the iPad over the image. The HP Reveal app recognizes the object and triggers an overlay image. The historic images in the exhibit are paired with the views of the same scenes as they appear today or a similar business that is currently in McKinney. Through the use of augmented reality (AR) visitors are able to compare for themselves McKinney Then and Now.
