Director of Engineering Gary Graham stated a flood plain study is needed to identify the flood plain as a preventive measure against to harm to future development.

John James (Applicant) 3025 CR 413, Melissa TX 75454, spoke in opposition to the recommendations of the staff.

Mayor Fuller called for Citizen Comments. There were no requests to speak.

Mayor Fuller called for Council and Manager Comments.

Council Member Charlie Philips announced and congratulated Council Member Frederick Frazier on his appointed to serve on the President's Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration of Justice, noting that Council Member Frazier was absent from the meeting due to attending business in Washington, D.C. Council Member Philips requested prayers for former McKinney High School Athletic Trainer Jeff Clark, who lost both legs due to diabetes and was recently fitted for prosthetics.

Council Member Scott Elliott commended the community organization Shiloh Place which serves the needs of homeless mothers. Council Member Elliott commented on the issues and challenges of individuals experiencing homelessness,

stating there are more than fifteen hundred (1,500) homeless enrolled in McKinney ISD, with eighty (80) percent of homeless families headed by moms.

Mayor Pro Tempore Rainey Rogers acknowledged reporter Emily Davis who wrote an article for Community Impact newspaper regarding the city's low crime rate despite population growth. Mayor Pro Tempore Rogers commended the McKinney Police Department and citizens for contributed to safety and a great quality of life in McKinney.

Council Member Shemwell applauded work of the Police Department and citizens for the low crime rate. Council Member Shemwell commented on the work and writings of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in traveling abroad in pursuit of justice. Council Member Shemwell stated Darius Tarver died by police shooting in Denton, Texas. Darius was the son of Kevin Tarver who serves on the McKinney Police Chief's Advisory Board. Council Member Shemwell expressed concern and requested prayers for the Tarver family.

Council Member Rick Franklin stated the Merritt Homes apartment will host a grand opening after redevelopment of the complex. The grand opening will take place on Wednesday, January 22.

City Manager Paul Grimes announced the Parks & Recreation Department will host a public information meeting about the Senior Recreation Center and Senior Pool located on College Street, Friday, January 31 to discuss updates to the existing facility. The City Council will meet on Friday, February 7 for a Strategic Goal Setting Work Session. The City Council will meet in joint session with McKinney ISD on Monday, February 10.

Mayor Fuller stated Carson Doss recently passed away, noting Mr. Doss' involvements in supporting the Martin Luther King, Jr. event in Allen, Texas and contributions to Ross Cemetery in McKinney. Community member Joy Flavall also passed away recently. Mayor Fuller expressed condolences to the Tarver, Doss and Flavall families. Mayor Fuller stated the McKinney Police Department has worked long and diligently to make progress in communities.

Mayor Fuller called for motion to adjourn. Council unanimously approved the motion by Council member La'Shadion Shemwell, seconded by Council member Scott Elliott, to adjourn. Mayor Fuller adjourned the meeting at 8:04 p.m.
