

## The Census Explained



- Counts EVERY person in the United States every 10 years. Collects name, age, race/ethnicity, gender, and relationships between each person in a household
- Determines number of seats each state gets in the U.S. House of Representatives
- Sent to every household in the United States, starting in mid-March 2020.
- For the 1<sup>st</sup> time, residents will be able to respond online, by phone, or by mail.

#### Why We Do a Census?



# It's in the constitution.

The U.S. Constitution mandates that everyone in the country be counted every 10 years. The first census was in 1790.

# Article 1, Section 2 of the US Constitution

The actual enumeration shall be made within three years after the first meeting of the Congress of the United States, and within every subsequent term of ten years, in such manner as they shall by law direct.

#### **Distribution of Resources**

- ✓ Distribution of more than \$675 billion annually in federal funds
- ✓ Redistricting of state legislative districts
- ✓ Forecasting of future transportation needs
- ✓ Determining areas eligible for housing assistance and rehabilitation loans
- ✓ Designing facilities for people with disabilities, the elderly and children



# Counting For Dollars in Texas

Texas received over \$59 billion in 2016 based on Decennial Census data.

The Counting for Dollars 2020 Project aims to understand 1) the extent to which the federal government will rely on data from the 2020 Census to guide the distribution of federal funding to states, localities, and households across the nation and 2) the impact of the accuracy of the 2020 Census on the fair, equitable distribution of these funds.

#### WHO?

Tribal, state, and local governments work together with partners to form CCCs to promote and encourage response to the 2020 Census in their communities. Community-based organizations also establish CCCs that reach out to their constituents.

#### WHAT?

A CCC is comprised of a broad spectrum of government and community leaders from education, business, healthcare, and other community organizations. These trusted voices develop and implement a 2020 Census awareness campaign based upon their knowledge of the local community to encourage a response.

#### WHEN?

The formation of CCCs is happening NOW! Leaders are identifying budget resources and establishing local work plans. In 2020, they will implement the plans and lead their communities to a successful census count.

## Why it Matters - Schools


- MISD officials rely on multiple resources, including Census 2020 data, to view show where new schools, roads, and other public facilities should be built.

#### **Statistics in Schools**


- MISD Educators, ESL Instructors and other Education Professionals can help educate students about the value of census data and its everyday use.

- Resources include State facts for students and classroom resources for Math, History, English, Geography and more.







#### Census 2020 Timeline



Personally respond to the census **online** for the first time! Mail and phone are still options

- Mid-March 2020: Census Bureau starts mailing letters with instructions how to complete your form
- April 1, 2020: Census Day
- May July 2020: Census takers go door-to-door for those who did not respond online or by mail or phone
