2) CDBG- CV (Cares Act) - \$ 500,444

Additional Funding Sources: Community Support Grant \$ 179,700 (proposed to Council, confirmed in August 2020)

In addition to CDBG funds, the City of McKinney allocates funds to public service agencies through Community Support Grants, separate from CDBG/federal requirements and not subject to predominately low to moderate income persons. Funding is available to non-profit community support agencies that provide activities, programs, and services to residents of McKinney. Funds for this grant come from the City of McKinney's General Fund.

Grant priorities are as follows:

- Basic Needs: including Food and clothing, Housing and Shelter, Non-financial Assistance
- Health and Medical Treatment: Including Mental Health
- Housing: Financial Assistance
- Transportation: The sole service being provided
