

In October 2020, the City of McKinney expects to receive the grant allocation of \$850,709 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The grant allocation will be used under the funding period October 1, 2020 to September 30, 2021. The Community Development Block Grant is a quality of life investment, serving to support and perform activities under CDBG National Objectives, to which principally assist low to moderate income persons; aid in the prevention or elimination of slum and blight, or meeting a need of urgency. Under the Consolidated Plan, funding will be used for identified community needs including but not limited to housing activities, public services, non-homeless special needs populations, non-housing community development needs and grant administration. In the Annual Action Plan services include youth services, domestic violence counseling, homelessness, and homeless prevention; abused/neglected children. Only 20% of the total grant allocation may be used for administration. No general fund support is supplemented under the CDBG program. Based on the goals and needs identified, the Community Grants Advisory Commission recommends the following activities.

Listed are the proposed activities for the first program year:

Funds will be used to pay for support and supervision of the court-mandated volunteer advocate program for abused and neglected children in McKinney. Regulatory citation: 24 CFR 570.201(e)/208(a)(2)(A).

2. Assistance Center of Collin County

1. CASA of Collin County

This program will provide Emergency Rental, Mortgage and Utility Assistance toward homeless prevention. Regulatory citation: 24 CFR 570.201(e)/208(a) (2)

3. Communities in Schools of the Dallas Region

Funding for the CISDR Program to return to Caldwell Elementary, providing comprehensive academic and support services for at-risk students. Regulatory citation: 24 CFR 570.201(e)/208(a)(2).

5. Hope's Door New Beginning Center

6. The Samaritan Inn

Funding will be used to assist at-risk students at the McKinney Center to provide resources to improve life and self-esteem skills through target programming. Regulatory Citation: 24 CFR 570.201(e)/208(a)(2).

Funding will be used to benefit McKinney domestic violence victims with counseling and life management skills Regulatory citation: 24 CFR 570.201(e)/208(a)(2).

Funding will be used to pay for a portion of case worker salary for McKinney shelter residents with job and housing placement assistance. Regulatory citation: 24 CFR 570.201(a)/208(a)(2).

7. Shiloh Place

Funding will be used to assist single mothers in the program to receive counseling and placement assistance Regulatory citation: 24 CFR 570.201(e)/208(a)(2).

8. City of McKinney Housing Rehabilitation Program

Funding may be used for activity delivery and direct services that may include housing rehabilitation grants; clearance and demolition; and possibly low-interest loans for low-to-moderate income owner-occupied housing, some of which may include historic preservation, lead-based paint remediation and reconstruction/gut rehabilitation. The program is citywide for eligible homeowners, with emphasis under census tracts 306, 307, 308 and 309. Terms of loans are based on need and ability to repay. Some loans may be forgivable. Locations unknown currently. Regulatory citation: 24 CFR 570.202, 208(a)(1)(3),570.201 (f)(ii).

Funding used for program delivery and related costs in providing oversight, monitoring, planning, and administration of the overall CDBG program, as well as evaluation, public education, fair housing activities and planning. Regulatory citation: 24 CFR 570.206(a)(b)(c).

CDBG-CV Funding (CARES Act) **Proposed Amount** \$500.444.00 Funding will be used under eligible CDBG funding activities to prevent, prepare, and respond to the spread of infectious diseases under Coronavirus disease (COVID-19). Eligible activities include but not limited to homeless prevention and health services.
