



Town Center Study


- Phase 1 Establishing the Vision

 McKinney, including the area east of Highway 5
 - Developed a Report and Illustrative Vision document
 - Key Concepts:
 - Encourage Redevelopment anchored by future transit village
 - Preserve existing neighborhoods
 - Old Settlers Park enhancement
 - Appropriate infill housing




History

Town Center Study

- -Phase 2 Implementing the Vision
 - 2008 present evaluating, crafting, selecting, relating and phasing appropriate implementation components into a plan of action.
 - Key Efforts:
 - Market feasibility analysis
 - Comprehensive downtown parking analysis
 - Creation of Town Center TIRZ (TIRZ No. 1)
 - Creation of McKinney Town Center (MTC) Zoning District










Parking

- Downtown McKinney uses a combination of public and private parking spaces.
- The City of McKinney provides the following spaces west of Highway 5:
- 1,081 in public lots
- 508 in public garages
- 601 on-street
- There are only 52 public lot parking spaces and very few on-street spaces east of Highway 5.





Key Infrastructure Projects

- The Proposed East Louisiana Parking Project will contain approximately 200 public parking spaces.
- The streets shown would provide necessary access to the district.
- The improvements would include on-street parking spaces, improve pedestrian access and promote additional development east of Highway 5



- The City of McKinney is currently negotiating the purchase of the property along Dungan Street in order to construct the public parking lot.
- Today's request is gauge Board support for the use of TIRZ funds for the following purposes:
 - Purchase of the property
 - Relocation costs
 - Design and construction of the East Louisiana Public Parking Lot
- Each of the items above will be brought back to the Board for approval when costs are known
