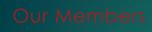


#### **Apex Centre**

The facility opened in 2017. By October 2018, we had grown to a little over 5,000 active households in our database. Today, we sit between 5,800-6,000 households which equates to a little over 16,000 individual members.

# Current Membership Data

- 89% are residents
- 61% of memberships are monthly
- 64% are family memberships
- ▶ We average 1,000 day pass users per month
- We average 40,000 member visits per month in the off season (September-May).
- During the months of May-August, we add an additional 800-1000 new households to our membership base. This takes us to over 18,000 members in the summer.

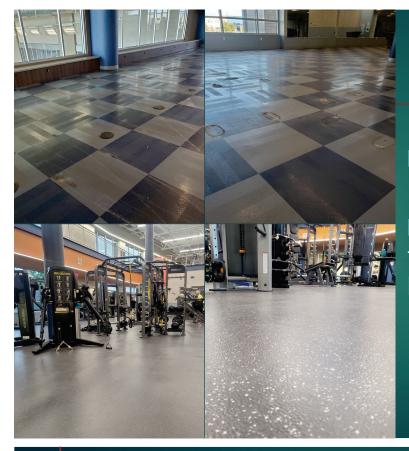
